Met Council's Livable Communities Program Explained at Spring CMAL Event

How Does the Livable Communities Grant Program Work? Is it Effective? Who Benefits? Which Cities Participate? How are the Grants Used?

Many cities in the metro area have received grants to support construction of multi-family housing that not only meets the needs of our growing communities, but provides a number of units that are affordable to residents based on



their income according to Livable Communities Grant manager Tara Beard. Beard spoke at the virtual spring CMAL event on March 19, 2022 and answered questions.

Jennifer Faulkner, Community Development Director in Burnsville explained how Burnsville has used these grants to construct a number of mixed-use housing projects that provide housing as well as jobs.

More Detail on upcoming LWV ABC Book and Film Club Selections

April LWV ABC Book Club



Join us on **Wednesday April 20** for the continued discussion on *White Rage - The Unspoken Truth of Our Racial Divide* (2016) by Carol Anderson.

While most history books focus on markers of progress, Anderson, a Professor of African American Studies at Emory University, focuses on the aftermath and backlash against five instances of civil rights progress. In March, we had a lively discussion of Reconstruction and the Great Migration. In April, we will discuss the remainder of the book which focuses on the aftermath of Brown v Board of Education (Chapter 3), the Civil Rights and Voting Rights Acts (Chapter 4) and the election of the first Black president (Chapter 5).

Whether you agree or disagree with Anderson's theory that each advance in African American civil rights was followed by expressions of "white rage", Anderson's book provides an interesting perspective and discusses some lessor known aspects of American history.

Join on us April 6 for a discussion of the film Luce (2019).

Luce is a psychological thriller about the events after a model student and former boy soldier writes an essay about Pan-Africanist writer Frantz Fanon, who advocated violence to defeat colonization. While we try to unravel the events that follow, we see how implicit bias and stereotyping can lead to assumptions, not just on the part of all the characters, but also by the audience.
