Mankiller (2017)

"My own role has just been to be here for a tiny period of time in the totality of history. I guess I don't think I leave any great legacy and I hope that when I leave, it will just be said that I did what I could." - Wilma Mankiller

Based in part on Wilma Mankiller's autobiography *Mankiller: A Chief and Her People*, this documentary by Valerie Red-Horse Mohl provides an indepth look at the life and work of Wilma Mankiller, the first female Principle Chief of the Cherokee Nation.

Mankiller's experience is inextricably linked to the fight of Indigenous persons in the USA and the doc observes the fight for sovereignty in tandem with her rise to power.

Highlights of the LWV ABC Board Meeting, June 28, 2021

The Board discussed the issue of how decisions are made about the subject of displays that are put up in the Anoka County Library System. The larger issues are; what is the role of public libraries in our communities, how independent the Library System should be, and the related issue of not having a trained librarian as the Director. Gretchen Sabel said that we will look into what League's position is on this issue.

How to handle signing up to volunteer for forums and voter registration events was next on the agenda. We are working on having an online system through Sign-up Genius as the principal method for sign up. A problem with doing it this way is that the Sign-up Genius site may be hard to find, so we would need to supply instructions for that.

The report on the LWV MN convention included a question about how the Vote411 web site is being handled. The problem seemed to be that the staff is overwhelmed by the amount of work involved in having the site complete and up-to-date for both urban and rural elections. We decided to write a letter to the state league, letting them know of our concerns.
