The Powering Democracy Awards will be presented at the 2022 LWV US Convention in recognition of Leagues for their work exemplary over the past biennium. This awards theme was inspired by the LWV US Women Power Democracy campaign. Finalists support the Women Power Democracy goals and/or the goals of the Campaign for Making Democracy Work and Strategic Framework. Submissions reflect that LWV is an organization fully committed to Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) in principle and in practice.

The 2022 Awards offer separate subcategories for state and local Leagues. All winners will receive a cash prize from LWVUS in recognition of their work. Finalists were selected by LWVUS staff and winners will be selected by the public via polls. LWV ABC has been nominated for the Powering Democracy award, which showcases how Leagues activated their grassroots network to empower voters and advocate change around key issues, such as protecting voting rights or increasing voter registration and turnout. .


LWV ABC Film Discussion for June – on Zoom



Highlights of the LWV ABC Board Meeting, May 23, 2022

The Anoka County Historical Society has developed the booklet on the 100 year history of LWV ABC that we assisted with, and we discussed how we would support the publication costs. Because there are so many unknowns as to staff time devoted to it, printing costs, and how many copies to print, we decided to allot an amount in our budget that would be dependent on our finding out more information on the costs of the project.

LWVUS has proposed a change in how membership dues are divided between all levels of League. The plan is that it would eliminate financial barriers to participation in League, and overall simplify the process of joining League. We discussed the difficulties involved in such a change, including the cost of keeping data bases up to date, and decided that there was a great deal to think about in this proposal, and to share our concerns before the National Convention.

The Program Committee reported on the format for the June membership meeting on climate change issues. We will have a presentation by a specialist with Hennepin County's Environment and Energy Department, have a question and answer session, and then have breakout rooms to discuss plans to implement the information.

The Voter Service Committee reported on all the many plans in place this year for voter registration activities at high schools, community events, libraries, and putting up digital billboards encouraging people to get involved and get out and vote!
