Voter Services Report

Our committee is gearing up for a busy fall. From now through October 1, we've scheduled 11 voter registration events on nine separate dates at Fulton-Montgomery Community College; Union College; I Am Father and Caribbean Day Festivals; Sycamore (formerly SiCM); and the YWCA.

The main event is National Voter Registration Day (NVRD), Tuesday, September 17. We will need 10 volunteers to register voters at three sites: the Price Chopper in Glenville and on Eastern Parkway, from 2-6 PM, and Schenectady County Community College. If you would like to volunteer for NVRD, or any other registration event, please check the google docs sign-up sheet at <u>LWV voter registration</u> or send me an email and I'll be happy to help.

At NVRD, as we talk with people and register voters, we'll offer them pocket Constitutions (and quizzes) in honor of the upcoming Constitution Day, to remind people of that document's essential role in our democracy.

The National Voter Registration Day organization offers small grants to organizations to register voters on that day. We've applied for money to help purchase more Constitutions, more flags, more student-oriented 'Vote Today, Shape Tomorrow' stickers, and more stickers for children accompanying their parents to the grocery stores. The idea is to freely hand out these items to passersby, as a way to start a conversation about voting.

Actually, start now by reading Anita Sanchez's piece 'The Art of Tabling.' If you didn't see it in the last bulletin, it's on our website at: https://my.lwv.org/new-york/schenectady-county/voting. Then share your ideas for what else we can do to make every registration day a 'Voter Engagement Day.'

Keeping Power in the Hands of the People

The Republican-controlled North Carolina Legislature, asserting that state legislatures had exclusive power over redistricting, petitioned the Supreme Court for review, after the state supreme court struck down its redistricting plan.

Fighting for Lifesaving Abortion Care

LWVUS and nearly 100 other organizations joined an amicus brief arguing that the federal *Emergency Medical Treatment and Labor Act* (EMTALA) preempts Idaho's abortion ban, which prohibits abortion in all instances unless necessary to save the life of the mother. EMTALA requires hospitals participating in Medicare to provide stabilizing care to any individual experiencing a medical emergency, regardless of their ability to pay.

Fighting Racial Gerrymandering

LWV of South Carolina and LWVUS filed amicus briefs at the United States Supreme Court supporting plaintiffs seeking affirmation of a three-judge panel ruling that found South Carolina's first congressional district to be a racial gerrymander. The plaintiffs argued the state legislature violated the Fifteenth Amendment and Fourteenth Amendment's Equal Protection Clause by dividing Black communities and voters among multiple districts to reduce their power to affect elections.
