Letter from the President - November 2023

Dear LWVSC Friends,

Did you know that the League of Women Voters is on a "transformation journey"? Begun in 2016, the League has been working hard to review its By-Laws, assess its organizational structure, and confirm its commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion. Using surveys, working groups, and board discussions (local, state, and national) LWV has been developing a new structural framework. Implementation of this new structure has begun, and Framing the Future has been the theme for 2023.

One of the plans of the "framing" will affect local Leagues, State Leagues, and the national League itself. LWV will institute a new national dues structure. The goal is to streamline the way we pay our dues which has become cumbersome for many Leagues and labor intensive for everyone. Here are some of the basic points of this new process that should take place at some point in 2024-2025:

- Dues will be set at \$75 for single memberships for <u>all</u> Leagues. Family memberships will be set at \$112.50. Up to now, each League set their own dues amount.
- Both new and continuing members will be given the choice to "pay what you want" with a minimum dues amount being \$20.
- There will be no change for Life Members (those who have been members for 50 or more years). Life members do not pay dues.
- If possible, all members will be asked to join or renew <u>online</u>. Local Leagues like ours may continue to accept checks for dues payment; however, this will be a slower process.
- All dues will go directly to the national organization LWVUS, which will retain 33%, pay out 47% to State Leagues, and 20% to local Leagues. Local Leagues should see an increase of what they are now receiving under the current membership process.

This is still a work in progress, so additional information will be forthcoming over the coming months, and I will keep you posted. We all look forward to a smooth transition.
