- Identify the on-going changes in health care and recommend appropriate action
- Identify and advocate for issues related to immigration and naturalization.
- Support and advocate for strong public education
- Identify, and advocate issues related to climate change and the environment, including Brown County recycling, landfill and waste disposal
- Advocate for fair, honest, and transparent elections

<u>Recommended Action Priority Items</u>: Action Priority Items are based on existing national, state and local positions.

- Educate the membership and community about Fair Voting Maps and advocate League's position
- Educate the membership and community about the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact and advocate League's position
- As a nonpartisan organization encourage people to seek election or appointment to public office in order to have a representative government
- Promote voter interest, education, registration, and turnout
- Promote accessible, affordable, and preventive health care.
- To meet the needs of public education research, inform the public, and communicate with legislators and policy makers about: the need for sufficient state funding, the impact of vouchers, and the need for high quality teacher preparation.
- Commit to Observer Corps members attending Brown County Board and Green Bay City Council meetings. Reports from observers at other Brown County area meetings will be accepted.
- Monitor
 - 1. Programs and services related to the needs of the educationally, socially, and economically disadvantaged
 - 2. Human trafficking
 - 3. Community and legislative efforts as related to sexual health
 - 4. Community efforts as related to substance abuse and behavioral health issues
 - 5. Public transportation
