# The League of Women Voters of New Castle County invites you to its monthly TED X Talk Discussion The Great Migration and the Power of a Single Decision May 18 at 1:00

Meet at St. Philip's Lutheran Church, 5320 Limestone Road, Wilmington Del. 19808.

The format is to watch the TED X Talk and then discuss the Ideas Worth Sharing. Bring your own beverage and snack if desired.

At present, in Delaware and elsewhere, there is a lot of activity taking place to address the new Jim Crow issues. The TED Talk for May, *The Great Migration and the Power of a Single Decision*, by Isabel Wilkerson, speaks to the single decision that changed the course of American history. Ms. Wilkerson lays out the story of the Great Migration from the Jim Crow South to the North and West between World War I and the 1970s. This migration demonstrated how the lowest caste people in America made a decision to take a chance, to choose for themselves so that they could offer their innate talents to the greater good. These talents were not permitted to be used in public in the South. Wilkerson explains - "These people, by their actions, were able to do what the powers that be, North and South, could not or would not do," she says. "They freed themselves."



Join us for this TED Talk that unwinds the story of the Jim Crow South and the personal stories of the people making the decision to leave their families, in some cases never to see them again, to head to the North and West for a better life.

Ms. Wilkerson is a Pulitzer-winning journalist and the author of the heavily researched book, *The Warmth of Other Suns*, the story of the Great Migration. Ms. Wilkerson uses narrative history to bring to light our shared humanity.

The discussion will begin at 1:00 on May 18, 2019, at St. Philip's Lutheran Church, 5320 Limestone Road, Wilmington DE 19808. The format for the discussion will be to view the TED Talk presentation and then discuss the highlights of the presentation.

# League Launches Campaign Around For The People Act

On Sunday, newspaper ads began dropping in several states pushing for a hearing in the U.S. Senate. The Act was passed in the House on March 8 and introduced in the Senate on March 27 by Senator Udall. # League Urges Presidential Candidates to Disclose Their Big-Money Campaign Fundraisers

LWVUS joined a broad cross-partisan coalition <u>urging presidential candidates to disclose their big-money campaign fundraisers</u>. These large-dollar donors, commonly referred to as bundlers, often raise thousands, even millions of dollars, to help raise funds necessary to wage competitive campaigns.

# Blog: Census Litigation Before SCOTUS This Week

On Tuesday, the U.S. Supreme Court heard *Department of Commerce v. New York*, a case challenging the current Administration's decision to add a question about citizenship to the 2020 Census. The addition of this question has been controversial and is expected to have a chilling impact on Census participation, particularly in hard to count communities. The League of Women Voters of New York State (LWVNYS) is a plaintiff on the litigation, and LWVUS joined more than 175 civic organizations in filing an amicus brief in this case. <u>Read more.</u>
