NO DISAPPOINTMENTS IN MCMANUS PRESENTATION!

Dr .Susan McManus was the speaker at the Annual Meeting on April 9, 2016 and , per usual, she did an exceptional job of sharing her insights in the political realm.

Some points she made:

• Florida is, of course, a key state in the general elections. It is key to winning the White House and Congress. In 2012, the difference between votes for Romney and Obama was just .09%. We need to educate people about the district changes.



- Florida is the most diverse state in many respects. Party affiliation is 38% Democrat, 35% Republican, 27% Independent and that number is rising. Racially we are 13% Black, 15% Hispanic, and 66% Caucasian.
- Two basic influences in the mood of the country are trust levels and fear. The approval rating of Congress is at 12%. People fear for their personal safety (mass shootings) and security (terrorism).
- This election season there is the strongest link ever between pop culture and the election. Majority of Trump followers are white uneducated males. The language of Trump reflects the reality shows in which harsh, vicious language is used. Trump's own *Apprentice* is an example.
- More minority women win than minority men when running for office.
- A generational shift is a major change occurring. 48% of registered voters are Millennials and Generation X. The younger generation cannot be reached with the same media and message as the older generation.
- Women are a majority among voters: 45% men, 58% women.
- Religion is not playing a major role in the 2016 election.
- Our area is the largest media market in Florida. It and Orlando command 44% of the media.
- Florida is a top state in donations. The swing vote is located in the suburbs. In 2012, you had opportunities to see the Presidential candidates a minimum of four times.
- Two thirds of Americans do not go through college. Civics is vital in public education!
