 - Household supplies: Laundry detergent, paper towels, toilet paper, dishwashing soap

members may include drafting questions for the Candidate Forums, Action Alerts to legislators, etc.



The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks by Rebecca Skloot

Henrietta Lacks was an African-American woman who died of cervical cancer in 1951, but whose cancer cells were taken without her consent and became the first "immortal" human cell line, known as HeLa. The HeLa cells were used for a vast range of scientific research, from developing the polio vaccine to understanding cancer and genetics, but her family was unaware of



this for decades and did not benefit financially. Her story, the story of her family's experience, and the ethical issues of race and class in medicine are documented in this book.


Artificial Intelligence specialist Gus Mondalek's presentation was informative, engaging, and eye-opening. It afforded a look into the future of real vs fake news.
