

Sometimes called "the first Indian woman botanist," Janaki Ammal (1897-1984) made substantial contributions to the study of plant chromosomes and botanical

geography. After graduating with honors in Botany in her native India, **Ammal** traveled to Michigan to continue her studies. She went on to become the first woman ever to obtain a Ph.D. in botany in the US. These accomplishments were all the more remarkable at a time when literacy rates among Indian women were less than one percent, and fewer than 1,000 women in total were enrolled in education above the age of 16.
