Thursday, Februrary 28, 6:30 pm: Meet the Candidates Night at the Wakelin Room of the Wellesley Free Library. Free and open to the public.





### **Voter Services Needs You!**





### Massachusetts in the Woman Suffrage Movement: Revolutionary Reformers

Thursday, March 14, 7 - 8:30 pm at the Wakelin Room, Wellesley Free Library, co-sponsored by the Wellesley League and the Wellesley Free Library as part of Women's History Month. Massachusetts was at the center of the national struggle for women's rights. Long before the Civil War, Lucy Stone and other Massachusetts abolitionists opposed women's exclusion from political life. Their activities laid the foundation for the next generation of suffragists to triumph over tradition. Barbara Berenson gives these revolutionary reformers the attention they deserve in a compelling and engaging story. Berenson is a public historian, educator, and



author or editor of four books, as well as Senior Lawyer for the Mass. Supreme Judicial Court. Light refreshments will be served and all are welcome - this event is free and open to the public.

Are You Ready for the LWV Ballot Question Study?

The final countdown has begun until our LWV Wellesley BQS consensus meeting. Plan to attend on **Sunday**, **January 13, 1:30pm in the Arnold Room** of the Wellesley Free Library. A summary of the questions is available online. You are also welcome to attend our last committee meeting on Tuesday, December 18, 1 pm at

the Wellesley main library. Meanwhile, test your BQ knowledge!!

- 1. The language of the ballot question summary currently provided to voters in Massachusetts scores at:
  - (a) 3rd-grade reading level
  - (b) 8th-grade reading level
  - (c) 12th-grade reading level
  - (d) Requires a PhD
- **2. True or False:** Massachusetts law requires the state to provide a statement of the fiscal consequences of a successful ballot question; this statement may not exceed 100 words.
- **3. True or False:** The state of Massachusetts currently has an independent Citizen Initiative Review board which prepares the arguments for and against a proposed initiative.

#### **Answers**

- 1. (c) Current Massachusetts ballot summaries have been scored as requiring 14 years of education This is the 10th lowest readability score in the nation.
- 2. True. The Massachusetts Secretary of Administration and Finance prepares a statement of the fiscal consequences of potential successful ballot questions.
- 4. False. Currently, the Secretary of the Commonwealth seeks arguments for and against from the principal proponents and opponents. If there is more than one proponent or opponent group, the Secretary determines who is best able to present the argument for and against the measure.
