

voting system that allows voters to rank many candidates on a ballot in order of preference rather than choosing one candidate. With very few exceptions, all elections in Massachusetts could use RCV. Friedman served on the executive committee of a RCV statewide ballot question campaign in Massachusetts. He serves on the boards of MassVOTE and Common Cause Massachusetts and has been involved in lobbying and organizing around various voting and democracy reforms for over ten years. 

LWVMA 2019 Convention Overview

Several members of LWV Wellesley attended the LWV State Convention, held June 7-8 in Westford, MA. In addition to electing new members to the State Board (including our own Tanya Roy as Director), those attending the convention voted to adopt a position on the initiative and referendum process which resulted from the Ballot Question study, as well as a position on immigration (by concurrence with the LWV Illinois).

A call to action from keynote speaker Bill McKibben, a noted environmental activist, resulted in strong support for a "Climate Emergency Resolution" – the State Board and local leagues are urged to advocate for declarations of 'Climate Emergency' and urgent relevant action by state and local governments. Other speakers addressed the status of



election security in Massachusetts, legislative priorities for newly elected state legislators, and efforts by the LWV to improve its efforts for greater diversity and inclusion. More information is available at the LWVMA website.


