It is really easy to invite your friends on Facebook:

- 1) Go to the League of Women Voters of Wellesley Facebook page.
- 2) Click on the "..." to the right of the "Share" button
- 3) Select "Invite Friends" from the pulldown menu
- 4) Click the circle to the right of the name of people who appear in the list who DO NOT have a green checkmark with the word "liked" next to it (those people have already liked the page). Please select anyone who is currently a member, and also any Wellesley friend who you think might be interested in joining or in just seeing what we post.
- 5) Write a message to your friends like "Hi! I'm inviting you to like this page because you are a League member or I think you might like to be! (Or you might just want to see all the interesting events we run and information we post)."
- 6) Click "Send Invites"
- 7) You are done!

Let's try to increase our exposure! Don't feel bad about inviting everyone. It is easy for people to decline if they aren't interested.

News from State and Local Leagues

- Ballot Question Study Follow-Up: Thirty-six local Leagues (including LWVW) participated in the study. The consensus responses were compiled and considered, and a committee drafted a new LWVMA position. The board has approved the draft position, and it will be put forward for a vote at Convention 2019. The committee still has work to do--it will be determining actions that the League can take, short- and long-term, as a result of the new position.
- Program Planning Follow-Up: Twenty-two local Leagues (including LWVW) and two members-at-large participated in state program planning. The results will be compiled and presented to the board at its April meeting. The board will recommend Action Priorities, Study/Re-study and Concurrence to local Leagues, and the LWVMA program will be voted on at Convention 2019.
