received in the mail. Please RSVP as soon as possible to Irene Flint and let her know what you are bringing.



In Memoriam



Naomi (Nicki) Kessler, a recent LWVW member and Waterstone resident, died on December 22, 2018. She was a past president of the South Orange League of Women Voters and served two terms as an elected member of the South Orange/Maplewood New Jersey Board of Education. She and her husband were founding members of the Fair Housing Council and active in the civil rights

and peace movements. She attended the 1963 March on Washington featuring Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and remained politically active throughout her life.
