Black History Month



John R. Lewis was an influential American civil rights leader, politician, and author. He dedicated his life to fighting for equality, justice, and civil rights for all Americans. His most famous quote is "Get in good trouble, necessary trouble, and help redeem the soul of America." He played a pivotal role in the civil rights movement including the

Freedom Rides, the 1963 March on Washington, and the Selma to Montgomery March, where he was severely beaten. Lewis was a passionate advocate for nonviolent protest. He was co-founder and chairman of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). His unwavering commitment to justice led him to the U.S. House of Representatives, where he served Georgia's 5th congressional district for 17 terms. Lewis continued his fight for healthcare reform, social justice and voting rights, throughout his career. That latest Voting rights bill was named after him: John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act, HR 14. It passed in the House in Oct. 2021, but failed in the Senate in Nov. 2021.

To circulate petitions, here's what you need to do: 1.) REGISTER with Citizens Not Politicians <u>HERE</u>. and also register with Citizens Not Politicians - Summit County <u>HERE</u>.

2.) COMPLETE A TRAINING. Once you register you will see the dates for the training sessions. This is a requirement the campaign is insisting everyone do. Please try to get it done soon. We will also be offering in person training soon.

3.) CONTACT OUR PETITION CAPTAINS <u>Hilary Sullivan</u> or <u>Lorann</u> <u>Murphy</u> to let them know you've completed the training. Then sign up <u>here.</u> To get petition books to circulate, contact Lorann.

About the Petition:

The LWV of Ohio is joining forces with other Leagues and Common Cause Ohio to obtain signatures on the Citizens Not Politicians Amendment. This amendment:

- Creates the 15-member Ohio Citizens Redistricting Commission made up of Democratic, Republican, and Independent citizens who broadly represent the different geographic areas and demographics of the state.
- Bans current or former politicians, political party officials, lobbyists, and large political donors from the Commission.
- Requires fair and impartial districts by making it unconstitutional to draw voting districts that discriminate against or favor any political party or individual politician.
- Requires the commission to operate under an open and independent process.

1) LWVUS is changing the membership system. Members will pay LWVUS directly. Currently you pay your local chapter then our treasurer pays LWVUS and LWVO their portion of your dues. The new system will work in reverse with the local chapters receiving payment from LWVUS. There are a lot of questions still to be answered.

We expect that this new system will allow us to change our communication platform. This will be less cumbersome for our committee but generally seamless for our members. *If you have technical, social media, or writing skills the communications committee could really use your help!*

2) LWVH is considering changing from a 501c4 to a 501c3. At the Annual Meeting you can expect to hear the pros and cons of each and then we'll vote on how to proceed and if needed, vote on the appropriate amendments to our Bylaws.
