At the end of March, checking was \$3,596; savings was \$1,856 for a total of \$5,452.

Budget: The budget was presented to the Board for review and will be approved at the Annual Meeting in May.

Income: We received \$75 in dues and a \$25 contribution.

Expenses: \$368 for the last US Per Member Payment and \$218.50 for the last State PMP. The deposit of \$114 for half of the League tablecloth was paid to Fastsigns.

We have 49 paid members at the end of March and 56 in total.
