8. Ideas for implementing Local Issues for Emphasis/Directions to the Board:

LWVMC members George Reinhardt, Garth Saalfield, and community member Marcy Snyder shared a draft letter from the local Grassroots Institute to be presented to Mendocino County Board of Supervisors, Fort Bragg City Council, and perhaps other local city governments.

George said both the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors and the Fort Bragg City Council have climate crisis action plans in place and some studies have been done. The Grassroots Institute is requesting those action plans be implemented by setting aside in upcoming 2021-2022 budget development \$2 million of the county's almost \$17 million American Rescue Plan Act funds for 3 initiatives to reduce the adverse impacts of climate change. The 3 initiatives are: installation of photovoltaic panels on public buildings; installation of additional electric car charging stations; transition public transportation to electric vehicles.

These 3 members of the Grassroots Institute asked LWVMC to consider joining them and other community organizations to endorse this budget request. LWVMC Board will meet to discuss this request.

The officers of the League shall be President, a First Vice-President, a Second Vice-President; or two Co-Presidents and a Vice-President; a Secretary and a Treasurer who shall be elected for terms of one year by Local League members at an Annual meeting and shall take office immediately.
