#### REGISTRATION FOR THE JUNE 10 LWVMA 2023 CONVENTION DUE BY JUNE 1, 2023



#### CARBON COUNTDOWN 2023 ONLINE EVENT

A free online event will be held over two sessions, on Tuesday, May 16 at 7:00 pm, and on Saturday, May 20 at 9:30 am, to present strategies for Massachusetts to reach the state's climate goals. This is an opportunity to hear Massachusetts Climate Chief Melissa Hoffer and Lexington's Senator Michael Barrett discuss how the state will equitably achieve mandated carbon emissions reduction targets for 2030. The Saturday session will include breakout groups to focus on biodiversity, building electrification, geothermal heating and cooling and affordable housing. #### NATIONAL COUNCIL 2023 LAS VEGAS, NEVADA

The LWVUS National Council 2023 will take place June 23, 2023 through June 25, 2023 at the Palms Casino Resort in Las Vegas, NV. League state leaders are invited to attend in person with options for remote participation. The Council will focus on *Framing the Future,* including continuation of the structure transformation work in progress as well as ultimate goals for the League. A team of expert facilitators will guide attendees through a series of sessions focused on these topics. Work will be done in large and small group settings, and attendees can expect to leave Council with next steps, resources, and tools to bring back to their state and local Leagues.

## LWVUS ADVOCACY

#### LWVUS CONTINUE TO SUPPORT THE ERA



More than 100 years after some women gained the right to vote, approximately one-half the people of the United States are still not guaranteed equal treatment under the U.S. Constitution. The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) will update the U.S. Constitution to protect the equality of rights under the law regardless of sex. The ERA has met all ratification requirements, and the LWVUS continues to urge Congress to act to ensure that the ERA is published.

Joint resolutions have been introduced in both chambers of Congress that will both affirm that the ERA is a valid part of the Constitution and address the question of a ratification time limit. In April 2023, the Senate brought this resolution to the floor. A bipartisan majority of senators supported it but failed to reach the 60-vote threshold to overcome a filibuster. The League will keep pushing to gain support for this resolution in both chambers of Congress, and encourages all League members to contact their senators and congressional representatives to assert that the ERA is part of the Constitution. Inequality hurts everyone. It is past time for this inequity to be corrected.
