Highlights of LWV ABC Board Meeting, October 28, 2019

- We have done legislative interviews in the past, where we invite the legislators who represent all of the many areas our local league covers, to a question and answer session. The Board decided to plan to do the interviews again, probably in January before the session begins on February 11. Because we have 18 legislators who represent our members, we discussed breaking it up into smaller geographical units, and having the meetings at local libraries or coffee shops. We have a committee of three

members who will work on setting this up, and would welcome anyone else who is interested to join with them. We will talk about this at our November membership meeting.

- The Board discussed how to implement the results of a recently completed member survey that asked about their preferences for meeting dates and times. One issue was to have daytime meetings in January and February, and what day of the week to hold them. We felt that many members might not be able to make a daytime meeting during the week, and that a weekend meeting time might work better.
- We went over topics for upcoming membership meetings, including gun violence, the upcoming Presidential Primary, and reviewing our State League's positions on issues.

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion – Watchwords for LWV!

LWV at all levels is working to build a more diverse and inclusive League. LWV US is hosting a series of webinars – details below. These webinars are open to all, you are encouraged to attend a webinar and/or explore previous recordings and resources on the LWV US website.

At the LWV MN gala, we heard from many diverse women who are groundbreakers in their field. Their stories are inspiring.
