Recently, some members of the Anoka City Council made statements in a meeting about LWV that were concerning. LWV responded at the September 26 Council work session, explaining forum procedures, LWV's nonpartisan policy and how we ensure that our forums are objective and fair to all candidates.

The League of Women Voters was formed in the 1920's with a goal of educating voters on issues and candidates, and ensuring that voting is accessible to all adult citizens. We have continued with that work for more than 100 years, and won't be stopping anytime soon.

National Voter Registration Day

Lead by Voter Registration Vice Chair **Cindy Wetzel**, LWV ABC had another successful National Voter Registration Day!

Through the efforts of **Alyson Gullette** and **Cindy Wetzell**, we partnered with four local high schools for National Voter Registration Day. Our in person registration at The Homestead in Anoka resulted in twelve voter registrations and an equal number of absentee ballot requests. Our voter registration efforts with senior housing residents and high schools will continue until the October 18 deadline for pre-registration.

Thanks to **Rachel Mero**, two digital Blip billboards on major Anoka County highways were activated about a week prior to NVRD (pictured above). The latest reports show the billboards were viewed by the passengers of 69,000 cars.

Our articles on NVRD appeared in three local newspapers and QCTV created, produced and aired a Public Service Announcement featuring an interview with **Cindy Wetzell** and live action shots of **Jody Anderson** registering voters.


September 26, 2022 Board Meeting

We discussed the objections that were raised about our League using the Anoka City Hall for recent candidate forums with no live audience in attendance. There will be an Anoka City Council work session this evening, where we will explain our position. In our publicity regarding this event, we clearly state that we would have no live audience because of Covid-19 and also because of the general incivility of meetings today. Our LWV MN President, Laura Helmer, will be speaking at the event tonight. We talked about the possibility of moving future candidate forums to a different location. We want to protect our reputation as a non-profit, non-political organization.

We received a report from our Voter Registration Committee, which included our having registration tables at a Ramsey Festival this summer, and at senior housing complexes. We are working on having posters and registration materials at area high schools this Fall, and we had two digital Blip billboards activated for National Voter Registration Day.

The Program Committee reported on the topics for the upcoming membership meetings. We will have Paul Linnell and Tom Hunt speak on voting issues in October. Rebecca Ebnet-Desens, Executive Secretary of the Anoka County Historical Society will speak in November, and the topic for January's climate meeting will potentially be on how the Inflation Reduction Act will help cover the cost of making home efficiency upgrades.

Register New Citizens

At the 2022 National Convention, it was noted that the Minnesota League, under the leadership of Judy Struthman of LWV Roseville, has the most successful, most comprehensive League new citizen voter registration program in the country. Registering thousands of new citizen each year is only possible with the help of League members throughout the Twin Cities.

Upcoming citizenship ceremonies will be held at the River Centre in St. Paul, with 15 short ceremonies each day (with around 1,000 new citizens getting registered to vote in total). LWVMN will have eight tables for League out in the hall where new citizens exit following their ceremony. 12 Volunteers are needed for each shift.

Each day will be split into two shifts. You can volunteer for one shift or both, and a reminder will be sent one week before your date with more details.
