Dues can be paid by check or by credit card through PayPal.




Piecing Together the Future: The Metropolitan Mosaic CMAL Annual Meeting Saturday, May 11, 2024 10:00 AM via Zoom



He brings more than three decades of professional production and performance experience to his latest creation, A Visit From Will Dilg, and his ongoing masterpiece, Our Mighty Mississippi. Marking is also a guest speaker on cruise vessels on the Mississippi.

About Will Dilg: In the early 1920's Will Dilg's only son drowned in the Mississippi River, which led Will to become a tireless, fanatic firebrand. In 1922 he became the founding president of the Izaak Walton League of America. In this role, he led an extraordinary national crusade to preserve a 261 mile stretch of Mississippi River Backwaters we now know - 100 years later - as the Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge.

- **Financial:** LWVMN's financial reserves remain strong but LWVMN is still needing to tap reserves to fund annual operations.

In May, LWVMN will be moving to a new office in the Landmark Center in St. Paul. The new location will have significantly lower rent and, unlike the current office, is fully accessible. LWVMN plans to hold an open house on August 20th.

The Landmark Center, built in 1892, was originally a federal court house. Now owned by Ramsey County, the building sometimes returns to that function when citizenship ceremonies are held there.

Civility Caucus

The Minnesota Legislative Civility Caucus was founded in 2017 to foster effective policy making by promoting trust and understanding between political parties. The Caucus is chaired by two legislators from each body, one Republican and one Democrat. Current chairs are Representatives Kristin Robbins and Sandra Feist (district includes southern Anoka county), and Senators Zack Duckworth and Grant Hauschild.

Caucus leadership works with the State of Minnesota's Office of Collaboration and Dispute Resolution to identify priority activities and directions for the caucus. Activities have included trainings on negotiation and collaboration, regular luncheons, service projects, structured activities to get to know each other on a personal level, opportunities for collaboration (such as co-authoring a bill), a legislator exchange program and the sharing of resources.

Representatives Robbins and Feist recently jointly sponsored a bill on cell phones in

schools.
