The Book of Lost Friends by Lisa Wingate


In this novel, Lisa Wingate brings to life stories from actual "Lost Friends" advertisements that appeared in Southern newspapers after the Civil War, as newly freed slaves desperately searched for loved ones who had been sold away.

Louisiana, 1875: In the tumultuous era of Reconstruction, three young women set off as unwilling companions on a perilous quest: Hannie, a freed slave; Lavinia, the pampered heir to a now destitute plantation; and Juneau Jane, Lavinia's Creole half-sister. Each carries private wounds and powerful secrets as they head for Texas, following roads rife with vigilantes and soldiers still fighting a war lost a decade before.

Louisiana, 1987: For first-year teacher Benedetta Silva, a subsidized job at a poor rural school seems like the ticket to canceling her hefty student debt—until she lands in a tiny, out-of-step Mississippi River town.

All candidates in the August primary races - Anoka Commissioner #1 and #5 and Ramsey City Council - have been sent an email by LWVMN. The June 20 email contains a personalized link to submit their candidate information and answers to 3 to 4 questions.

You can help make sure all voters in your area have access to this important candidate information.

Go to Vote411 and click on "Find out What's on my Ballot". On the next page simply enter your address. Your personal Voter Guide should list your candidates for the upcoming primary election. If any of your candidates have not responded, please contact them and request they participate in the Voter Guide. If candidates state they did get an email, they should check their spam folder or email LWVMN at vote411@lwvmn.org

LWVUS Convention 2024

Despite the chaotic nature of the hybrid Plenary Sessions of the 2024 LWVUS Convention from Washington, DC, business of the LWVUS was actually accomplished. Interestingly, electing the new President and Board and adopting a Budget/setting the final PMP for local Leagues was perhaps the easiest work in the first two days. There was far too much confusion with Amendments, so-called Points of Order, the virtual attendees, Parliamentary Procedural discussion, and unreliable timing of debates to permit the nomination of new Nominating Committee members, establishing Program pieces for the next two years, deciding on policy,

concurrences and updates for the full 10-hours of Plenary to run smoothly, but despite those concerns, run we did - even if we ran over by more than an hour, causing the Sunday finish-up session to begin an hour earlier - at 7AM!



2025-2026 LWVUS Program

Making Democracy Work

Convention delegates once again approved Making Democracy Work Campaign as the League program priority for 2025-2026. The Campaign for Making Democracy Work incudes redistricting reform, voting rights protection, improving elections, money in politics and direct election of the President by popular vote. LWVUS staff and financial resources will be prioritized in these areas.

Delegates adopted by concurrence the Washington position on the Decline of Local Newspapers which had been recently adopted by LWV Minnesota.

Delegates passed resolutions affirming our commitment to support DC Statehood, Reproductive Rights, Ethics in Government, Public Libraries, Climate and Immigration reform. Delegates also authorized a LWVUS study of the Federal Judiciary. LWVUS does not currently have a position on the Federal Judiciary.

New LWVUS President and CEO

Convention 2024 delegates elected Dianna Wynn as the new President of LWVUS. A member of LWV Wake County (Raleigh, North Carolina), a communications expert and former President of ACLU North Carolina, Wynn was first elected to the LWVUS Board in 2022.

At the convention, the LWVUS board announced the unanimous appointment of Celina Stewart as the new Chief Executive Officer. Stewart joined the LWVUS litigation staff in 2018, most recently serving as Chief Counsel.

Kim Teehee, Keynote Speaker

Kim Teehee, director of government relations for the Cherokee Nation, was the keynote speaker at the LWVUS 56th National Convention in Washington, DC. Teehee is the delegate-designate to the U.S. House of Representatives from the Cherokee Nation.

Since 2019, the Cherokee has asserted its right to a delegate in the U.S. House of Representatives. The Treaty of Hopewell of 1785 and the Treaty of New Echota of 1835 both state that the Cherokee Nation "shall be entitled to a delegate in the House of Representatives of the United States whenever Congress shall make provision for the same."

The House has not yet voted to seat Teehee. Once seated, her role will be non-voting, similar to those of representatives from Washington D.C., Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Guam, Northern Mariana Islands, and the United States Virgin Islands.
