

Caste: The Origins of Our Discontents (2020) by Isabel Wilkerson

Isabel Wilkerson gives us a masterful portrait of an unseen phenomenon in America as she explores, through an immersive, deeply researched narrative and stories about real people, how America today and throughout its history has been shaped by a hidden caste system, a rigid hierarchy of human rankings.

Using riveting stories about people—including Martin Luther King, Jr., baseball's Satchel Paige, a single father and his toddler son, Wilkerson herself, and many others—she shows the ways that the insidious undertow of caste is experienced every day. She documents how the Nazis studied the racial systems in America to plan their out-cast of the Jews; she discusses why the cruel logic of caste requires that there be a bottom rung for those in the middle to measure themselves against; she writes about the surprising health costs of caste, in depression and life expectancy, and the effects of this hierarchy on our culture and politics. Finally, she points forward to ways America can move beyond the artificial and destructive separations of human divisions, toward hope in our common humanity.


Nauman participated in CMAL's 2018-2019 <u>Study of Metro Council</u> <u>Governance</u> by giving an interview.

Imagining 2050

In October, CMAL hosted Todd Graham, Principal Forecaster for the Met Council who presented the "Imagining 2050:Post-Pandemic Demographic Trends in Greater Minnesota and the Metro Area."

Forecasts and modeling help plan for future employment, economic, housing and transportation needs. Projections are built upon historical data. If something dramatic occurs, such as a pandemic or a precipitous decline in green cards, forecasts will need to be adjusted. The newest projections are slightly modified from previous forecasts, reflecting demographic changes related to the pandemic.

Population is expected to increase steadily with an expected population of 3,820,000 in the Twin Cities by 2050. In the Twin Cities, the over 65 population, as a percent of total population, will double from 11% in 2010 to 22% in 2050, changing the type of housing, transportation and services that will be in demand.

After the current recovery, an economic slowdown will be forced by a workforce shortage. Minnesota will need international immigrants to grow the work force. Birth rate has declined, especially since 2020. Rate of domestic migration to Minnesota has slowed since other metro areas now have equally low unemployment rates. Hurricane or other climate migrants do not tend to move to Minnesota, often just moving inland in the same general area.



LWVUS Federal Judiciary Study

Coming soon

At the 2024 LWVUS Convention, delegates overwhelmingly agreed to conduct a new national study on the Federal Judiciary.

The study committee was charged with developing a LWV position on the Federal Judiciary as an essential component of US democracy to be presented at LWVUS Council in June 2025.

The purpose of the study includes but is not limited to, addressing concerns and clarifying judicial accountability, transparency, independence, and ethics. The scope of the study is to address the Supreme Court as well as the other Article III federal courts.

LWV ABC members will be asked to address consensus questions sometime between February 7 and April 14.

Chapter Spot Update

The New LWVUS Membership System

The first week of February, every current member of LWV will receive an email invitation from LWVUS inviting them to log-in and set up a ChapterSpot account.

You will log-in with your email. A code will be set to your email which you will then enter (instead of a password) to create your ChapterSpot account. Your contact information will already be in the system. This is your opportunity to make sure that the correct information was imported from the old system and correct any errors. You will be asked to submit some demographic information and answer a few interest questions.

The demographic questions will be the same for everyone in the country. The interest questions are specific to LWV ABC. These questions were primarily designed with new members in mind, but will also be helpful information for LWV ABC to help meet the needs and interests of all members.

The questions submitted by LWV ABC for inclusion in the new system are:

- 1. What is your primary reason(s) for joining the League of Women Voters?
- 2. Which league activities, if any, are you interested in becoming actively involved with (e.g. candidate forums, voter registration, observation of public meetings, advocacy for League public policy positions)?
- 3. What public policy issues are you interested in?

- 4. Do you have any communication interests or skills (e.g. graphic design, social media, film editing/producing, website management, public speaking, publicity) that you would like to use?
- 5. Do you belong to any non-partisan organizations that may be interested in partnering with LWV ABC for projects of mutual interest?
- 6. LWV ABC shares contact information with other LWV ABC members to facilitate collaboration on activities. Check this box if you grant permission to share your contact information.

Environmental Injustice

Our health is directly impacted by the location of oil and gas facilities, the amount of plastics and carcinogens in our drinking water and the air we breathe, and the number of yearly natural disasters. Not all people are equally affected by these environmental factors.

In this presentation, Keisha Ray, PhD discusses the realities of environmental injustice by demonstrating the clinical and ethical implications of our unhealthy environments. She will discuss the ethical decisions about health equity and class and racial disparities in health that environmental injustices forces us to make and

how they affect the number of clinical interventions available to remedy our poor health.
