Take a trip into the future... with a discussion about the future of Public Libraries, featuring Ruth Hemingson, Branch Manager of the




Northtown Public Library.

## Successful Forum for District 11 School Board

Thank you to Geri Nelson and Arlene Gillett, our Voter Services co-chairs, for organizing a successful forum for Anoka-Hennepin District 11 School Board candidates. The event was held on October 6 at the Sandburg Education Center in Anoka. Our partner, QCTV, was on hand to tape the event for replay on local cable stations. - There are three Anoka Hennepin school board seats on the ballot on November 3.
  In District 1, which represents Anoka and parts of Ramsey, Coon Rapids and Andover, incumbent Tom Heidemann of Anoka is running unopposed.
- In District 2, which represents Blaine and a portion of Coon Rapids, incumbent Marci Anderson of Blaine is running unopposed.
- In District 5, which represents Brooklyn Center, Brooklyn Park, Fridley and a portion of Coon Rapids, incumbent Nicole Hayes of Brooklyn Park and Scott Simmons, also of Brooklyn Park, have filed for candidacy.


