## Upcoming Budget

At our April Annual Meeting, LWV ABC members will be approving a budget for the April 2026 - March 2027 fiscal year. The Budget Committee, chaired by **Betsy O'Berry**, will begin meeting in January to develop a budget recommendation.

The board has recognized two major issues in developing the upcoming budget: the increasing costs for candidate forums and an invoice for a Per Member Payment (PMP) for Fiscal Year 2026. Board members continue to research these issues and explore options and solutions.

### The PMP Issue

Prior to February 2025, members paid annual membership dues to LWV ABC, who then paid dues on each member's behalf to both LWVUS and LWVMN. Both LWVUS and LWVMN billed us annually for a Per Member Payment (PMP), calculated on number of members on January 31. In recent years, LWVMN billed LWV ABC in March, with payment due in June. Our last payment to LWVMN was made in 2025.

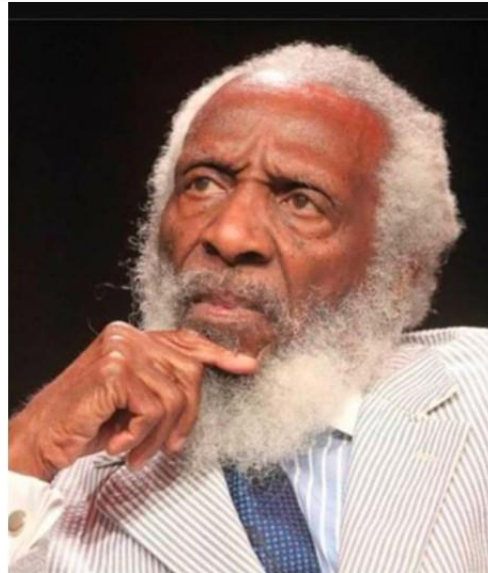
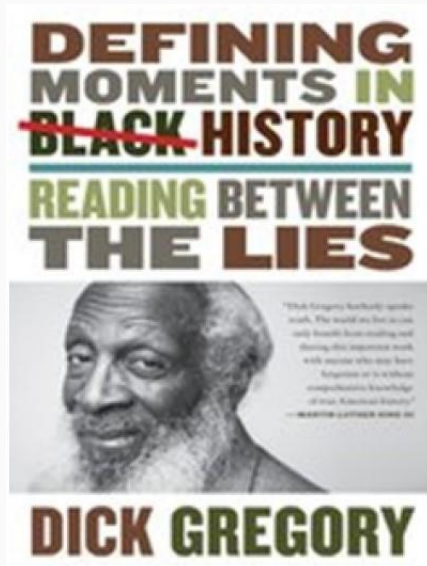
LWVUS has been billing local Leagues in August with payment due the **following** year in June. Unfortunately, this aspect of the old system was retained when League switched to the new ChapterSpot system. Although members have been paying LWVUS dues in real time since February 2025, LWVUS has billed LWV ABC for FY2026 based on our membership on January 31, 2025.

### One Partial Solution

LWVUS will allow us to reduce this FY2026 PMP payment by the amount of any donations made by our members to LWVUS.

### ***Defining Moments in Black History: Reading Between the Lies (2017)* by Dick Gregory**

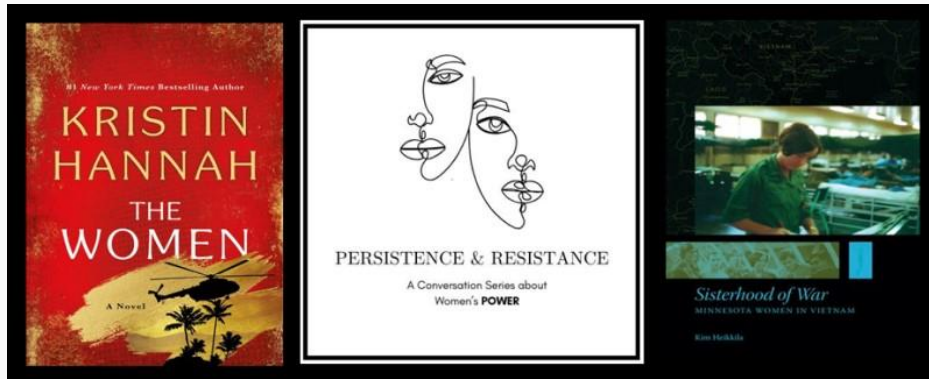

## **Precinct Caucuses**

**February 3, 2026**

**7:00 PM**

Want to have an impact on your party's platform and priorities? Your neighborhood precinct caucus is the place to start.

Caucuses are the first step in a series of meetings where parties set their goals and



values (party platforms), select delegates for conventions, and endorse candidates. All attendees can propose resolutions. If your resolution is passed by at the caucus, it moves up to higher-level conventions and could eventually become part of the official party platform.

You can participate in a caucus if you are eligible to vote in the November general election (including 17-year-olds who will turn 18 by then), live in the precinct and generally agree with the principles and values of the political party hosting the caucus. Minnesota does not have party registration.

### **Tips for Writing A Resolution**

- Keep it focused: Stick to a single, clear issue per resolution.
- Be concise: Use everyday language and get straight to the point.
- Follow your party's format and guidelines



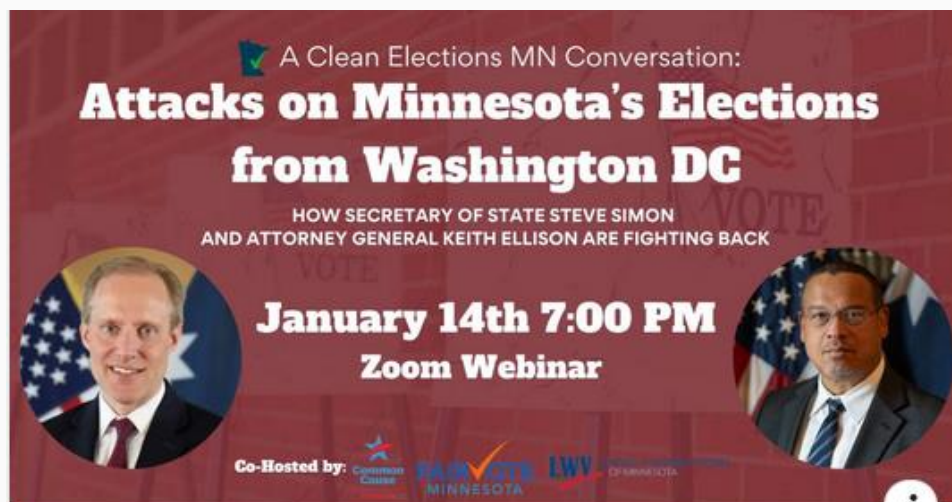

# Attacks on Minnesota's Elections from Washington DC

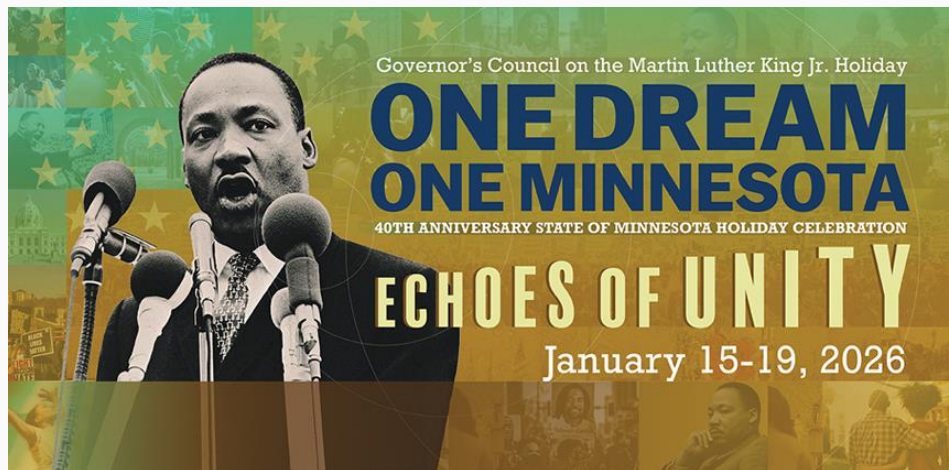

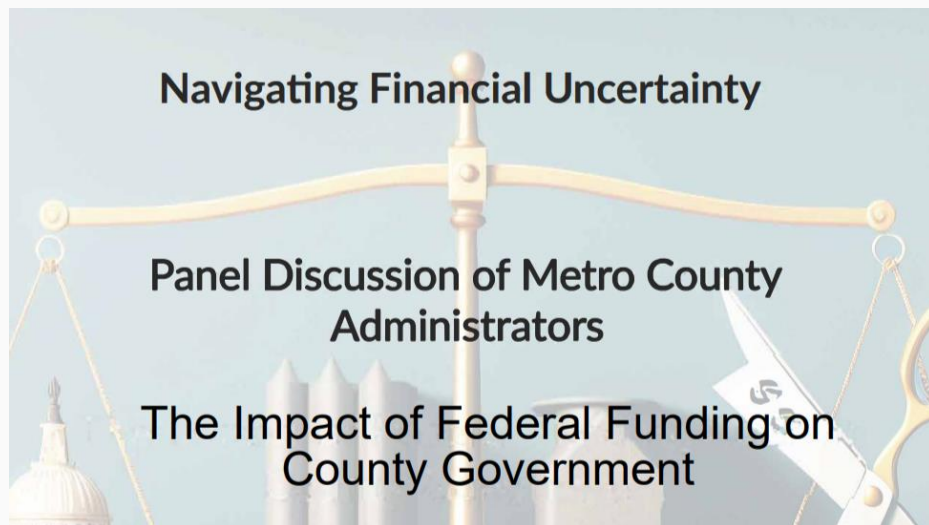
