

NOVEMBER 7, 2023 VOTING INFORMATION

Ohio's voter ID laws were updated in 2023 and are more restrictive in requirements for in-person voting. This infographic details the changes.

ID Requirements for Ohio Voters have CHANGED

Make sure you have the necessary identification to successfully vote!



In-Person Voting

One of the following unexpired documents required:

- Ohio Driver's License or interim ID form or Ohio ID (issued by Ohio BMV)
- U.S. Military or U.S. Dept. of Veterans Affairs or Ohio National Guard card
- · U.S. passport or passport card

You can NO LONGER use a letter from the University, a utility bill, paycheck, etc. to vote, but you CAN vote by mail using the last 4 digits of your social security number.



Vote by Mail

One of the following items required:

- Last 4 digits of social security number
- Ohio Driver's License number or Ohio ID number (unexpired & issued by Ohio BMV)
- A copy of one of the documents listed to the left under "In-Person Voting"

If you don't have the correct ID to vote in person, request an absentee ballot NOW at VoteOhio.gov You'll have the option of printing the request form or requesting that it be mailed to you.



Whether you vote in person or by mail, make sure that you update your address at VoteOhio.gov if you've moved since you last voted. Update your information by October 10 to be sure that you can vote on November 7.

Considerations for all voters:

- 1. <u>Check your voter registration status</u> at VoteOhio.gov. Make sure that you are registered to vote in Ohio.
- 2. <u>Make sure that the address for your voter registration is up to date</u>; if it's not, update it no later than October 10. This is the last day for voter registration and voter name/address changes.

Special considerations for student voters:

- 1. College students who have an Ohio driver's license or Ohio BMV-issued ID and are registered to vote in Ohio have to decide if they wish to vote using their college address or their home address. Regardless of which address they choose, they need to decide whether to vote in person or via mail. If they prefer to vote in Oxford, they need to update their voter registration to reflect their college address. The address in the voter registration database does not need to match the address on the Ohio driver's license.
- 2. <u>College students who come to Ohio from out-of-state and are registered to vote in Ohio</u> may not have the necessary ID to vote in person. If that is the case, they can still vote using a vote-by-mail ballot.
- 3. Students with out-of-state driver's licenses have asked us if they should get an Ohio driver's license. WE DON'T KNOW what impact this may have on the student's financial aid, family auto insurance policy or other circumstances. The student may choose to do so if they determine that it's the right thing for them. When obtaining an Ohio driver's license or Ohio ID, it's important to understand that they would have to relinquish a driver's license from another state, as the law prohibits anyone from holding a state-issued license from more than one state.

If you want to vote-by-mail this November, ACT NOW. The Board of Elections must receive the completed vote-by-mail application by October 31.

October 10 Last day to register to vote

Board of Elections open until 9pm



Polls open 6:30am - 7:30pm



October 11 Early voting begins

Week 1 (October 11 - October 13): 8am - 5pm each weekday (Wed - Fri)

Week 2 (October 16 - October 20): 8am - 5pm each weekday (Mon - Fri)

Week 3 (October 23 - October 27): 8am - 5pm each weekday (Mon - Fri)

Week 4 (October 30 - November 5):

7:30am - 7:30pm on Monday 7:30am - 8:30pm on Tuesday 7:30am - 7:30pm Wednesday - Friday 8am - 4pm on Saturday 1pm - 5pm on Sunday



Vote by Mail Deadlines

October 31

Vote-by-mail application must be received by Board of Elections Board of Elections open until 8:30pm

November 6

If returned by U.S. Mail, vote-by-mail ballot must be postmarked by November 6 and received by November 13.

If returned in person to the Board of Elections, the vote-by-mail ballot must be dropped by 7:30pm on Election Day.
