Your Advocacy Committee is currently working to support a pre-trial bill package that was introduced and referred to the Michigan House Judiciary Committee on October 20, 2021. The bills are sponsored by a bipartisan set of Representatives and align to LWVMI's recently adopted Criminal Justice Position. These bills specifically address decriminalizing poverty.
