The Oroville City Council is elected by the citizens of Oroville to guide the public policy affairs of the community. The City Council appoints the City Administrator and Department Heads, City Attorney and City Commission/Committee Members. The Council also serves as Commissioners for the Oroville Successor Agency.

Number of elected members: 7

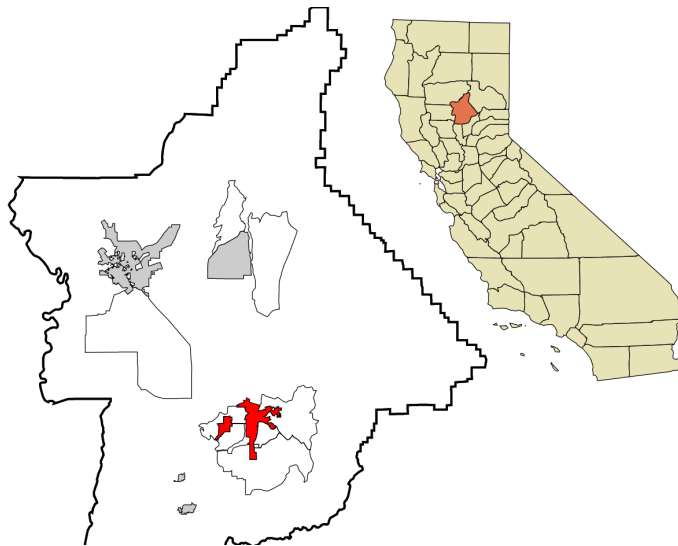
Elected at large

Note:

Oroville's City Council is undergoing a districting process in which Oroville's City Council will transition from at-large elections to by-district elections, meaning that city council members will have to live in the district they represent and voters residing in each district will elect their respective council member. Oroville will continue to have six City Council members and a mayor who will be elected by all voters in the City.

The 2010 United States Census. The racial makeup was 11,686 (75.2%) White, 453 (2.9%) African American, 573 (3.7%) Native American, 1,238 (8.0%) Asian, 56 (0.4%) Pacific Islander, 554 (3.6%) from other races, and 986 (6.3%) from two or more races. Hispanic or Latino of any race were 1,945 persons (12.5%).

Special qualifications required: Must be over 18 and live within Oroville city limits

Length of term: 4 years

Financial compensation:

- Council members receive \$400.00 per month plus \$5.00 per meeting. The Mayor receives \$500.00 per month plus \$5.00 per meeting.
- Council members and the Mayor can receive health insurance for themselves and their family while on the Council at no cost.

Board Meetings:

The City Charter requires a minimum of one meeting per month on the first Tuesday. However, the City Council typically has two meetings per month one on the first Tuesday of the month and the second on the third Tuesday of the month. The meetings occur at City Hall 1735 Montgomery Street, Oroville Ca 95965. The meetings are all posted on line prior to the meeting and yes the location and time is posted.
