Responsibilities of the government entity:

In the United States an irrigation district is a cooperative, self-governing public corporation set up as a subdivision of the State government, with definite geographic boundaries, organized, and having taxing power to obtain and distribute water for irrigation of lands within the district; created under the authority of a State legislature with the consent of a designated fraction of the landowners or citizens. The primary responsibility of the Board is the formulation and evaluation of policy. The Board of Directors is committed to providing excellence in leadership that result in the provision of the highest quality of services to its constituents.

Demographics: The 2010 United States Census reported that Paradise had a population of 26,218. The population density was 1,430.9 people per square mile (552.5/km²). The racial makeup of Paradise was 24,129 (92.0%) white, 112 (0.4%) African American, 301 (1.1%) Native American, 330 (1.3%) Asian, 24 (0.1%) Pacific Islander, 416 (1.6%) from other races, and 906 (3.5%) from two or more races. Hispanics or Latinos of any race were 1,836 persons (7.0%).



Special Qualifications:

The candidate must meet the following qualifications: Candidate shall be a voter in the district and a resident of the division that he or she represents at the time of his or her nomination or appointment and through his or her entire term. "Voter" means a registered voter in the district. The residency requirement is met if the person was domiciled in the division for which they seek to run for elective office, at the time of the Camp Fire and intends to maintain such as his/her permanent residence.

Length of term: The term of each member of the Board shall be four years, with the term of approximately half the Board expiring every two years.
