Kathy Rector:

1. What in your background, education, and experience makes you a good candidate for office, and what do you consider important skills and qualities for a city councilor to possess?

I've been active in many community events and organizations. I was an EMT for around 30 years, responding to countless emergencies in town and the surrounding area. I've been active in the Powers Church of God teaching Sunday school classes and leading music worship. I was on the Powers Clinic board of directors for several years and have been active in school events as an employee for several years and as a parent of five children who have gone through the school system here.
