PROGRAM PLANNING: WHAT IS IT?

Program Planning is the heart of the League's commitment to grassroots participation.



Program Planning is an opportunity for members to recommend to their local, state, and national boards which issues are most important to them.

"Program" is the issue or issues that will be the central focus of work for a League for a specific time period.

Leagues at each level—national, state, local—select a "program"

Why? Selecting a program keeps the League focused. Focusing brings results.

If other needs arise, we adapt and our focus may change.

PROGRAM PLANNING PROCESS

How it works...



Local Leagues gather.



Members discuss and weigh issues.



Discussion leads to recommendations.



Recommendations are sent to the relevent board—LWVUS, LWVNY, or LWV Cooperstown.



Board makes recommendation for program adoption to convention delegates or at local annual meeting.

Did you know?

- LWVUS holds its convention in even years.
- LWVNY holds its conventions in odd years.
- LWV Cooperstown Area holds annual meetings.

Program Planning is also an opportunity for each League to tell the LWVNY which other issues concern our League.

If enough Leagues have the same concern, the LWVNY Board may decide to recommend other issues to the delegates at convention.

This year there are two issues other Leagues have put forth for consideration for concurrence:

- 1. Rank Choice Voting
- 2. Solid Waste



MEMBER AGREEMENT USING CONCURRENCE

Before the League can take action, members must agree in broad terms on what they think about various aspects of the policy issue. The nature of the issue will affect how it is studied and how positions are reached.

The appropriate (local, state or national) board usually selects the method to be used:

Consensus: where agreement is reached using League responses to specific questions

Concurrence where agreement or a vote on a pre-stated position is required. Will our League agree that to concur with one or both of the following positions?

The technique most often used in the League for reaching member agreement is CONSENSUS by group discussion. It is not a simple majority, nor is it unanimity; rather it is the *overall sense of the group* as expressed through the exchange of ideas and opinions, whether in a meeting of the full membership or a series of smaller discussion meetings.

CONCURRENCE ISSUE I

RANK CHOICE VOTING

Should the LWV of the Cooperstown Area concur with the LWVNYC's position on Rank Choice Voting?

Should the League support ranked-choice voting (sometimes called —IRV— "instant runoff voting") in all local elections, including primaries, specials, and general elections in all state-wide elections even when restricted to primary elections only. If the proposed Rank Choice Voting concurrence passes at convention, the LWNVY would support a voting system that allowed voters the option to rank at least three and at most six candidates for a given office. CONCURRENCE II: WASTE

Members of the League of Women Voters in Albany, Rensselaer, Saratoga, and Schenectady Counties agree that effective policies concerning waste are integral to ensuring the clean water, clean air and healthful environment guaranteed in the Environmental Rights Amendment to the New York State Constitution. We also agree that we're embedded in an ecosystem, and that the land, water, air, energy, waste and biota in our ecosystem are dynamically interrelated. Learn more on our website.



WHAT RECOMMENDING WILL MEAN

Moving Issue Forward

If enough Leagues agree that we should concur, the LWVNY board will decide if the issue should be a recommended item.

No recommendation

Items not recommended by the LWVNY board may still be considered, but proponents must convince delegates to put forth the issue for a vote.
