The minutes from the previous two meetings were approved.

New Business

It was approved to change the rental agreement policy for nonprofit groups from \$100 for once a week use for the year to \$5 per hour (not including the dining room) starting in January.

The money previously approved for labor for the Seaside infield project had to be increased to \$8248 and was approved by the Board.
