Recreation and Parks Commission meeting Tuesday, February 15, 7:00 pm LWVM Observer - Kay Rieper

The work at Stramski's is progressing. The stream has been cleared out and the water is running freely. This is an ongoing issue. He will need a new mower in the spring.

Jaime Bloch - Recreation

There will now be no masks required except at the programs at Glover and Bell schools in compliance with the schools' mask requirements. Programs are ending and the next round will begin after February vacation. She hopes to have an indoor soccer program

for 4 and 5 year olds, and this summer she is planning a half day community playground program for the same age group. Her assistant Olivia is doing an excellent job and will be playground program director. She is hoping to have a half day ski trip on March 9 (early release Wednesdays) and an inflatable mini golf afternoon on March 30. She is also partnering with the library for monthly meetings for summer reading.

The new ability to use credit cards for registration, as well as making sure there is room in the programs, has increased the early registration revenue significantly. She will be purchasing 9 new sailboats at \$7500 per boat, delivered, with all the necessary accessories.

She would really like to have the bathrooms at Stramski's available for summer programs.
