minutes. The mayor will also be part of the mix.


The Roundtable will be held at Hudson High School from 6:30pm to 9:00pm in the Media Center. An elevator will be available.

If you didn't make it to the September 14 member meeting, you missed an interesting presentation from Kyle Herman who leads the Rank the Vote effort in Ohio. He explained the variety of reasons that people give for not voting: 1) No one represents me. 2) Nothing will change. 3) I don't like any of the candidates. 4) Don't have time. 5) System is too broken anyway.

He also explained some of the benefits of Rank Choice Voting:

- Discourages negative campaigning
- Encourages more people to run
- Gives voters more choice and more voice
