# Free Hot Topic Evening Event Sept. 25: Locked in, Locked out — Prison Reform

Dr. Keith Reeves, Professor of Political Science at Swarthmore College, will discuss the collateral consequences of having 2.3 million of our fellow citizens incarcerated. Dr. Reeves is the founder of the college's inprison education program. He will focus on the implications of mass incarceration for racial equality, justice and democracy in America.

He is the department chair and director of the Urban Inequality and Incarceration Program at the college's Lang Center for Civic and Social Responsibility.

Previously, Dr. Reeves was an associate professor of public policy at Harvard University's John. F. Kennedy School of Government. He is also a former Henry Luce Scholar and the author of "Voting Hopes or Fears?: White Voters, Black Candidates & Racial Politics in America."

The program will be at the Media Borough Hall Community Room, 301 N. Jackson St., Media, at 7 p.m., Sept. 25. No need to make reservations.

# Action Alert: Tell Congress to 'Do Something'

Earlier this year, the U.S. House passed legislation requiring universal background checks on every firearm sale and transfer, appropriating funds for gun violence research, and closing loopholes in laws that allow stalkers to obtain guns. And now it's time for us to ensure the U.S. Senate does the same.

Over a 48 hour period from August 3 to August 4, our we saw 22 people killed in El Paso, Texas, 10 in Dayton, Ohio,

and a third mass shooting in Odessa and Midland, TX on August 31, where seven people were killed.

Call or email your senators, <u>Bob Casey</u> and <u>Pat Toomey</u> to demand action on the House bills and to ban assault weapons. You can phone their Senate offices at 202-224-3121 and follow the prompts.


