## FIRST AMENDMENT SERIES: THE RIGHT TO PETITION THE GOVERNMENT FOR A REDRESS OF GRIEVANCES

Join us for a discussion with attorneys **Paul Gillies**, **John Franco**, Professor **Peter Teachout** and moderator, **Cary Brown**, Executive Director, Vermont Commission on Women.

**Franco** was Dean Corren's attorney in his fight against the Attorney General's claim that Corren violated Vermont's campaign finance law. **Gillies** represented a group of South Burlington residents who sued the school district in civil court, arguing that the school mascot "Rebel" name change should have been left to the voters of the city rather than the school board. **Teachout** is an expert on Constitutional Law.



**Cary Brown** served two terms as Commissioner of the Vermont Commission on Women before joining the staff in 2012.
