The LWV ABC Voter Services committee successfully completed ten Meet the Candidates Forums before the Primary Election.

Our primary videos were viewed by over 4,100 on YouTube, in addition to everyone who viewed the forums during the numerous broadcasts on local cable channels.

General Election Forums

Our Voter Service committee is busy scheduling Meet the Candidates Forums for 46 contested races in our service area. Not all candidates have confirmed their attendance, so please encourage your local candidates to confirm their attendance.

In 2020, LWV ABC forums had nearly 18,000 views on social media, in addition to the frequent local cable channel broadcasts and on demand viewing.

Note that most forums will again be recorded without a live audience. The two exceptions are live forums in Columbia Heights and Ham Lake as noted on the schedule.


The new and improved LWVUS Vote411.org website offers Voter Guides based on questionnaires sent to all candidates in the United States.



The LWV ABC Voter and Election Information webpage has links to everything you need to know about voting and elections.


Our latest updates include the new election district maps for Anoka County, information about Minnesota election security and integrity and how to report any problems you observe on election day.

Anoka County has a new Elections Manager!

Tom Hunt was appointed Anoka County's new elections manager. The Anoka County Board August 9 unanimously named Hunt to succeed Paul Linnell who accepted a position in the elections department of the Minnesota Secretary of State's Office.

Hunt is a resident of Ramsey. He was hired to be lead elections specialist in Anoka County elections office in 2019...being involved in three elections since starting with the county. As elections manager, he will be in charge of the planning and administration of all elections. Hunt credits Linnell with being a great mentor to him.



August Board Meeting

The Board unanimously agreed to honor Rebecca Ebnet-Desens and the staff of the Anoka County Historical Society as this year's Friend of League. The recognition stems back to their extensive exhibit in 2019 honoring

the women of Anoka County and LWV ABC and coincides with their current publishing of an LWV ABC history booklet. The award will be presented at our November 14 program meeting when Rebecca is our guest speaker.

Other meeting items included:

- Discussion of overlap between LWV ABC and LWV New Brighton membership in southern Anoka County.
- Plans for fall meetings, hybrid, are underway.
- The newsletter is changing to an e-newsletter solely, no more .pdf of a longer document.



Register New Citizens

Join League members from throughout the Twin Cities area to help new citizens get registered to vote.

Upcoming citizenship ceremonies will be held at the River Centre in St. Paul, with 15 short ceremonies each day (with around 1,000 new citizens getting registered to vote

in total). LWVMN will have eight tables for League out in the hall where new citizens exit following their ceremony. 12 Volunteers are needed for each shift.

Each day will be split into two shifts. You can volunteer for one shift or both, and a reminder will be sent one week before your date with more details. Masks are required.






