# *From LWVUS:* League Condemns Gun Violence

PORTLAND, WASHINGTON – The League of Women Voters of Maine and the League of Women Voters of the United States issued this statement following the acts of violence and active shooter situation in Lewiston.

"The League is heartbroken for our friends and neighbors in the Lewiston area and grieves for their losses. We must stop these tragedies from happening. Something must change, and it's within our power to do so. For now, we are taking a moment to process and grieve for the Maine families affected by this preventable act of violence.

"The League condemns gun violence. Mass shootings have become all too common in America. These latest events rock Maine to its core and signify that common sense gun laws are necessary to prevent further tragedies.

"The Maine legislature will meet in January 2024. The League of Women Voters has held the position since 1990 that the proliferation of handguns and semi-automatic assault weapons in the United States is a major health and safety threat to its citizens. The League will support legislation written to limit gun violence and better support Mainers in a mental health crisis.

"The League of Women Voters of Maine supports common sense gun legislation, like strong background checks, gun safety education, and annual license renewal. Going forward in the next half of the 131st legislature, we will support the ongoing work around this issue and offer positions on existing and forthcoming legislation. Legislators must work to enact policy changes to protect Mainers.

"Mainers are strong and resilient, and we will use our power to protect our communities."

## Advocacy by Richard Larsen

Advocacy **Take Action** Items are typically requests for you to send petitions to our various Legislators both California and US. To **Take Action**, you click on the **Take Action** or similar request, and the next screen will have a form to fill out that typically contains your name, address, and email. This information is used solely to identify your Legislator and provide your email address to the Legislator for his/her response to you, which they typically do. The form also contains a written petition and an additional box/block so you can write your own if you wish.

There were several Advocacy items to take action on in October, both from LWVC and Common Cause that were distributed to our Advocacy group.. These are summarized here;

- 1. At the end of September we received the LWVC Highlights which contained six Take Action Items for October. They were;
  - NEW! Stop voter discrimination and support the <u>John R. Lewis Voting</u> <u>Rights Advancement Act</u>!
  - Urge Congress to expand the right to vote!
  - Demand bipartisan cooperation on voting rights!
  - Tell your senators to enshrine sex-based equality by <u>affirming the Equal</u> <u>Rights Amendment as part of our Constitution!</u>
  - Urge Congress to address the climate crisis and protect our youth!
  - Reduce the influence of dark money by promoting the DISCLOSE Act!

2. On October 11 we received a request from LWVUS to again address the climate crisis to protect our youth.

3. On October 13 we received a request from Common Cause to ask Michigan lawmakers to be the next state to join the **National Popular Vote** to fix our broken Electoral College.

4. Then on October 20 we received an Action Alert from LWVC calling on Californians to urge federal representatives to support funding for climate-smart agriculture and conservation technical assistance in the 2023 Farm Bill. A request for advocacy action was also sent out on October 25 to the California State Board of Education on school redistricting at the request of our ILO President Susan Guilford.

5. "The League of Women Voters of Orange County, an InterLeague Organization, a coalition of Leagues within Orange County, opposes the petition of the Orange County Board of Education to take over the functions of the Orange County Committee on School District Organization, whose duties include setting new district boundaries every 10 years." Members and friends are invited to also submit their comments to the California State Board of Education. <u>here</u>
