Observer Corps Report by Karen Bender

Today's report covers August and September up to 9/16.

In August **Fullerton City Council** discussed a possible sales tax increase to help cover the budget deficit.

Our new **La Habra City Council** observer, Richard Larsen, reports that on September 16, a "public comments" speaker on behalf of United Sovereign Americans raising voting and election concerns.

The **Orange County Board of Supervisors (BOS)** supports two bills in progress that assist in preventing homelessness: AB 2498 (Zbur), providing counties with funding to administer a housing subsidy to eligible persons, and SB1032 (Padilla), authorizing the Dept. of Housing and Community Development to forgive the full amount of the principal, interest, and fees if the borrower makes specified showings.

Regular attendees for the public comment section of the BOS meeting are a group identifying itself as United Sovereign Americans and sometimes "reorganized" or "new" California. They sequentially "comment" or "read" their lengthy written agenda into the minutes. Their focus is to change current voting practices.

Supervisors Sarmiento and Foley have demanded that Supervisor Do, District 1, step down in response to allegations that Supervisor Do mishandled millions of dollars in discretionary COVID funds. His removal was to be on the agenda for 9/10; however, at this meeting we learned the BOS does not have the power to remove him. The Attorney General can remove him, or he can resign; so far, he's refusing to resign. The Board of Supervisors did censure Supervisor Do "for demonstrating reckless and unethical conduct in the performance of his duties as a fiduciary of public funds."

Orange County has dropped its contract with Mind OC, a non-profit organization that oversees the Be Well Mental Health Program. According to the **Voice of OC** a recent audit found program failures "like failing to properly train staff and correctly bill the county."

An agenda item at the August 7th **BOE** meeting was a Resolution to oppose Assembly Bill 1955 regarding Parent Notification that was signed into law on July 15, 2024. The Board's Resolution concludes with a statement of intention to challenge AB1955 in federal court. The Resolution passed 5 to 0.

Advocacy by Richard Larsen

This is a list of requests for petitions distributed to the LWVNOC Advocacy group in September to take action on.

On the 5th we received a petition request from California Common Cause to petition our governor to sign bills AB 2839 to keep deepfakes out of campaign adds and AB 2655, which combats online disinformation mostly regarding AI deepfakes which have been in use.



On the 12th we received a petition request from LWVUS to tell Congress to act on the ERA to celebrate International Day of Democracy because today in the US, women's rights are still not guaranteed.

On the 18th we received a petition request from US Common Cause to petition our Congress to prevent election deniers from shutting down our government and to resist the efforts of a group of radical lawmakers who've demanded an extreme new law meant to deter newly naturalized citizens from voting and to make it harder for all citizens to vote.

Also on the 18th we received a petition from LWVC to petition our Governor to sign AB 544, which places polling locations inside jails, allowing any eligible incarcerated person to register and cast their votes in those jails as a pilot program.

On the 19th we received a petition request from LWVUS to join them in calling on Congress to strengthen voting rights and to pass the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act to celebrate National Voter Registration Day.

On the 22nd we received a petition request from US Common Cause to petition Sen. Lindsey Graham about a last minute effort to have Nebraska change its election rules by returning to a winner-take-all electoral college vote. Politicians shouldn't be allowed to switch the rules at the last minute to gain a partisan advantage.

On the 25th we received a petition from LWVUS which was a forward from US Common Cause to tell Congress they must ban guns from polling places. We must ensure that our polling places remain sanctuaries for democracy.

Freedom from Intimidation in Elections Act

from LWVUS 9/26/2024

WASHINGTON, DC – The League of Women Voters of the United States is proud to support the Freedom from Intimidation in Elections Act, which will enshrine in law that every voter should have the right to cast their ballot free from fear and intimidation.

"This bill is a crucial step in protecting our elections and the individuals who make them possible. By establishing a presumption that openly carrying a firearm during election-related activities constitutes voter intimidation, this legislation strengthens the legal framework needed to prevent such threats. It also provides civil remedies for those who experience intimidation, supplementing existing criminal prohibitions, and allowing our justice system to hold those who violate these prohibitions accountable. This legislation reflects a growing recognition that the integrity of our elections must be preserved in the face of increasing threats.

In recent years, gun deregulation in some states, combined with increased political polarization and disinformation, has led to a disturbing rise in threats against election officials, poll workers, and even voters. The chilling reality of armed protesters gathering outside ballot-counting facilities and the armed surveillance of drop boxes during the 2020 election has highlighted the urgent need for stronger legislation and safeguards in this bill. This legislation addresses these concerns by updating existing anti-intimidation laws, ensuring that our democratic process remains secure and coercion-free.

The League of Women Voters stands firmly in support of this bill to ensure that every voter can participate without fear."
