Raptor Expert Will Conduct Presentation On Birds of Prey In Modern America

John Blakeman, a retired high school biology teacher, will give a presentation titled *Of Hawks and Men, Birds of Prey in Modern America* on Wednesday, October 8, at 6:30 p.m. at Way Library.

This program is part of the Mindful Matters series the Perrysburg League presents in collaboration with Way Library.

Through photos and stories he will explore both local and distant species with a special focus on the remarkable restoration of Bald Eagles in Ohio lakeshore counties — a true conservation success.

Mr. Blakeman, who lives near Sandusky, is an expert on raptors.

His interest dates back to the late 60's at Bowling Green State university where he

trained and displayed the university's live falcon mascot and also conducted feeding and physiology experiments with American kestrels.

He has studied hawks from Maine to Alaska and did a major hawk survey in northern Nevada. He also conducted one of the first raptor breeding projects.

One of Ohio's first licensed falconers, he attained the status of Master Falconer and was also one of Ohio's first raptor rehabilitators. Mr. Blakeman was a major participant in the Ohio Raptor Survey project, assessing the status of hawks and other raptors across the state.

In addition, Mr. Blakeman is an accomplished nature photographer and was founder of the Firelands Audubon Society. Professionally, he designs

native plant landscapes, featuring prairie grasses and wildflowers.



He has directed the restoration of thousands of acres of tall grass prairie at NASA Plum Brook Station in Sandusky and worked as a consultant to restore prairies in other locations. For these efforts he was named to the Ohio Natural Resources Hall of Fame, the state's top conservation honor.

Natural Resources News

Natural Resource Committee members recently lunched at Cocina de Carlos in Waterville. We went with a scorecard to help determine the eco-friendliness of the restaurant.

Our waiter inquired if we wanted water. The water arrived in glass, not plastic. The straws, neither plastic nor paper, were renewable and compostable.

We were given boxes made from sugar cane or avocado for our leftovers. These same non-plastic, non-styrofoam boxes are used for takeout. Takeout customers are asked if they need utensils and if yes, compostable ones are provided. The bags, if necessary for takeout, are imprinted with "This bag is our commitment to the environment — Reusable, Recyclable and Biodegradable."

Cocina de Carlos uses local vendors and farmers for meat and produce. They carry 15 local beers in addition to Mexican beers.

Because foods are cooked fresh, this restaurant does not have leftovers to deal with at the end of the day, which makes the need for leftover composting non-critical. However, the owner will look into the recently launched *Perrysburg Composts! Scraps to Soil Program* for disposal of kitchen food waste.

Tables are cleaned with a vinegar-based (not bleach) product in the interest of the health of children.

Editor's Note: Perrysburg's Lupita's Cantina, another restaurant owned by Carlos Mendez and his wife Lupita, also follows the same practices.
