# **President's Message**

I'm happy to report that after a month of transition, we have a full Board. Juanita Roland volunteered to finish out the term of Treasurer since she is experienced with online accounting programs. Iris Levitis volunteered to take over as Voter editor. She's a League member from Wisconsin returning with her family to her California roots. I volunteered to finish out the current term of President and all three of us were appointed to our "new" positions at the October Board meeting.

During this round of musical chairs, our members didn't miss a beat. Donna Roper and Leona Judson organized candidate forums and pros and cons presentations. Debbie McKay held training sessions for members on registering voters and signed them up to "table" at farmers' markets and other events. Debbie and Donna worked with Burbank Housing to do door to door voter registration at low income housing sites. We provided three teams of volunteers and held a training session for their staff and volunteers on voter registration.

Anita Lytle and her team kept post offices, libraries and other locations around Sonoma County supplied with voter registration cards.

To remind people to vote, we placed 200 bilingual 11" X 17: colorful, bilingual posters which say "SU VOTO = SU VOZ" and "YOUR VOTE = YOUR VOICE" out in our communities. Larger "Your Vote Matters" lawn signs have been placed at all public libraries, SRJC and SSU and various low income housing sites.

We distributed 1000 Voter's Edge cards to encourage more voters to use LWVC's informative online site votersedge.org has a strong Sonoma County page thanks to League member Marie Wardell.

So many League members have helped in so many ways this election season to educate and inform voters. Thanks to each and every one of you!

### Be Our Representative to the LWV Bay Area

We currently have an open seat for the LWVSC representative to the The League of Women Voters of the Bay Area (LWVBA). We invite you to volunteer. LWVBA, first organized in 1959, is one of the oldest organizations in the San Francisco Bay Area dedicated to the concept of regional solutions to area-wide problems. The LWVBA is an Inter-League Organization (ILO), a recognized level of LWVUS, and is comprised of all the local leagues in the nine counties that touch San Francisco Bay. Currently, this means about 4,000 members in 20 local Leagues.

At the bi-monthly meetings League representatives work together on common regional issues such as air & water quality, climate change, transportation, housing, regional ballot measures, regional government, and open space/land use. Meetings occur bi-monthly the 3rd Wednesday of even numbered months (Feb., Apr., June, Aug., Oct., Dec.). The meetings are held at 4th St., Oakland in the 7th Floor Conference room 10:30 am to about 12:30 pm. Representative from Bay Area Leagues gather for activity reports and updates to the Bay Area League. It is fascinating to learn what other local Leagues are doing. We share best practices and learn from each other. If you are interested in being our representative, please contact our current LWVSC President Susan Novak.

# What Is the Voter Registration Outreach Committee (VRO)?

This is the very active group of 16 persons (see below) who distribute and maintain the supply of voter registration forms in boxes at about 115 sites throughout Sonoma County. These sites include post offices, libraries, schools and other establishments. Before the General Election this year, we distributed over 2750 forms in the county.

We do this service as per our contract with the Registrar of Voters of Sonoma County. This contract provides a double benefit for our League: it supports our mission of encouraging voter registration and voting; secondly it pays a significant amount of money into our budget.

## **Voter Service**



October was a very busy month for Voter Service. We sponsored eight candidate forums and four pro and con forums. Total attendance for all events was over three hundred, with six hundred more viewing our YouTube videos of these events.

Our recent committee meeting reviewed this election cycle and came up with several good ideas to work on in the coming year as we prepare for the 2020 election. This would include more training for moderators; develop partnerships with SRJC and SSU to attract younger voters. Improve our media outreach to be more timely and user friendly. We'll also work on getting more regional representation beyond Santa Rosa with dedicated coordinators and community partnerships.

We'll take a rest for the rest of the year. Our next meeting will be January 24<sup>th</sup>. We welcome new and old members as we develop these ideas further.

# Highlights of Legislative Action from LWVC

The 2017-18 California legislative session is a wrap! Because you took action, we're celebrating some big wins!

- Clean energy got a big boost with the passage of SB 100! California will continue to lead the country in climate change action -- and 100% of your electricity will be from zero carbon sources by 2045.
- The flood of dark money coming into campaigns will be subject to greater transparency with the passage of the Disclose Act, AB 249.
   And by defeating AB 84 we prevented even more money from compromising our elections.
- We gained greater police accountability with the passage of SB 1421, which expands access to personnel and video records related to officer-involved killings.
