As League members I think we often get caught up in our local activities and programs without really exploring all of the resources that our State and National League have to offer us. I thought I would highlight a few that are either special because of our 100th anniversary or new offerings that offer opportunities for education and advocacy.

- For all of our avid readers, the LWV Ohio has collected a reference bibliography on the history of the Womens Suffrage Movement in the US. Also included in the collection are references specific to the contributions of women of color, as well as specific biographies of the leaders of the suffrage movement. You will find this collection under the tab *RESOURCES AND TOOLS* on the LWV Ohio website.
- 2. One of the newest education tools is a program developed to be a resource for teachers: Voting and Civics: Know your Ohio Government. This program was presented to members on October 1, of this year and is designed to engage students early on the importance of voting as well as resources for information i.e social media, visual aides. It also includes lesson plans for teachers. This is also located under the tab *RESOURCES AND TOOLS* on the website.
- 3. The LWVUS website is currently focused on election resources and concerns. Because redistricting is going to be an issue early in 2021, you may be interested in checking out all of the activities the LWVUS is involved as we approach that process. The website includes court cases that have been filed, as well as other resources/activities across many of the states.

The Ohio website gives access to media coverage of our league initiatives, as well as updates on legislative issues that affect voting and other advocacy. We are fortunate to have a core of lobbyists who represent the LWV in Ohio.

I challenge you all to take some time to check out both websites. I think you will appreciate all of what the league is doing to support a strong democracy.

For your information: Canada will ban single-use plastic items by the end of next year. The country plans to ban single-use plastics – checkout bags, straws, stir sticks, six-pack rings, cutlery and even foodware made from hard-to-recycle plastics – nationwide by the end of 2021.

CNN alert: Worldwide, people **ingest** an average of 5 grams of **plastic** every week, the equivalent of a **credit card**, a new study suggests. How is this happening? Plastic bags and bottles break down into tiny, tiny particles called microplastics which fill our air. These microplastics rain down on our water and earth. We drink them, ingest them, and inhale them.
