Mindful Matters

New Great Lakes Center Director to Share Current Research on Protecting Our Lakes

The Great Lakes hold 90% of North America's surface fresh water and are vital to our region's economy, ecology and culture.

Yet they face serious threats, including nutrient pollution, climate change, contaminants, habitat loss and biodiversity decline.

Dr. Sarah Emery, new director of the Bowling Green State University's Center for Great Lakes and Watershed Studies (CGLWS), will speak **Monday, November 17 at 6 p.m. at Way Library,** on this topic.

She will discuss these environmental changes and share highlights of the center's collaborative research to better undestand and protect Great Lakes systems.

The CGLWS aims to advance the understanding of the Great Lakes by encouraging and promoting multi-disciplinary and collaborative research.

Dr. Emery is a professor of biological sciences at Bowling Green. She earned her Ph.D. from Michigan State University.
