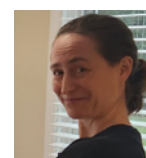

## President's Letter

Midterm elections are often called “quiet elections.”

Let me be very clear: **there is nothing quiet about what's ahead in 2026.**



This year voters will make decisions that shape our communities and our state for years to come. On the ballot, we will see **local county offices, state-level races including Governor, U.S. Senate, and Congressional seats** — leadership choices that directly affect policy, funding, and the direction of Ohio.

While November may feel far away, the work starts **now**. Ohio's primary is in May, and preparations for voter education, Vote411, and outreach are already underway. This is where the League excels — providing trusted, nonpartisan information so voters can make informed choices.

### **What is LWVPA doing right now:**

- Preparing for primary-season voter education and outreach
- Coordinating with the Ohio League on advocacy priorities and messaging
- Supporting Vote411 so voters have easy, reliable access to candidate and issue information
- Planning for fall candidate forums and election education programming

On February 7, we will co-host the **LWVO Democracy Defense Teach-In**, an opportunity to learn more about challenges facing our democratic systems and how Leagues across Ohio are responding through education, advocacy, and community engagement.

Midterms historically see lower turnout, but **we know the stakes are even higher this year**. Local and state offices determine how our communities grow and how public resources are allocated. **Congressional races will shape the composition and functioning of the Legislative branch, responsible for lawmaking, oversight, and representation. At a time when many citizens are concerned about gridlock and institutional performance, these races will influence how Congress carries out its constitutional responsibilities.**

This is our moment to **educate, engage, and empower voters**. Whether you help with voter guides, outreach, advocacy, or simply share accurate information, every contribution matters.

Democracy doesn't run on autopilot.  
It runs because people like you show up.

## Mindful Matters

### Explosive Volcanoes Beneath an Icy Sea: Expedition to Antarctica



The League of Women Voters of the Perrysburg Area in conjunction with Way Public Library will welcome Dr. Kurt S. Panter and Bowling Green State University graduate students for a panel discussion on their research trip to McMurdo Station in Antarctica on **Tuesday, February 19**, at 6 p.m. at the library.

This Mindful Matters talk will include a broad overview of Antarctica, their experiences living and working in that environment, as well as what their research is about.

These researchers returned from a months-long journey across the world to study undersea volcanoes in the Ross Sea, near the coast of Antarctica, shedding light on one of the least seen parts of the world.

BGSU Geology Professor Dr. Kurt Panter, as well as graduate students Katie Shanks '24 and Jacci Kalemba '24 spent two months aboard the *Nataniel B. Palmer*, a research-focused icebreaker, while fellow graduate student Robert O'Conke '24 organized the team's research and space preparations back in Bowling Green.

The ship departed from New Zealand and traveled more than 2,000 miles across the ocean into the southern Ross Sea to better understand the overall effects of volcanic activity in Antarctica, which is home to active volcanoes despite the glaciated environment of the region.

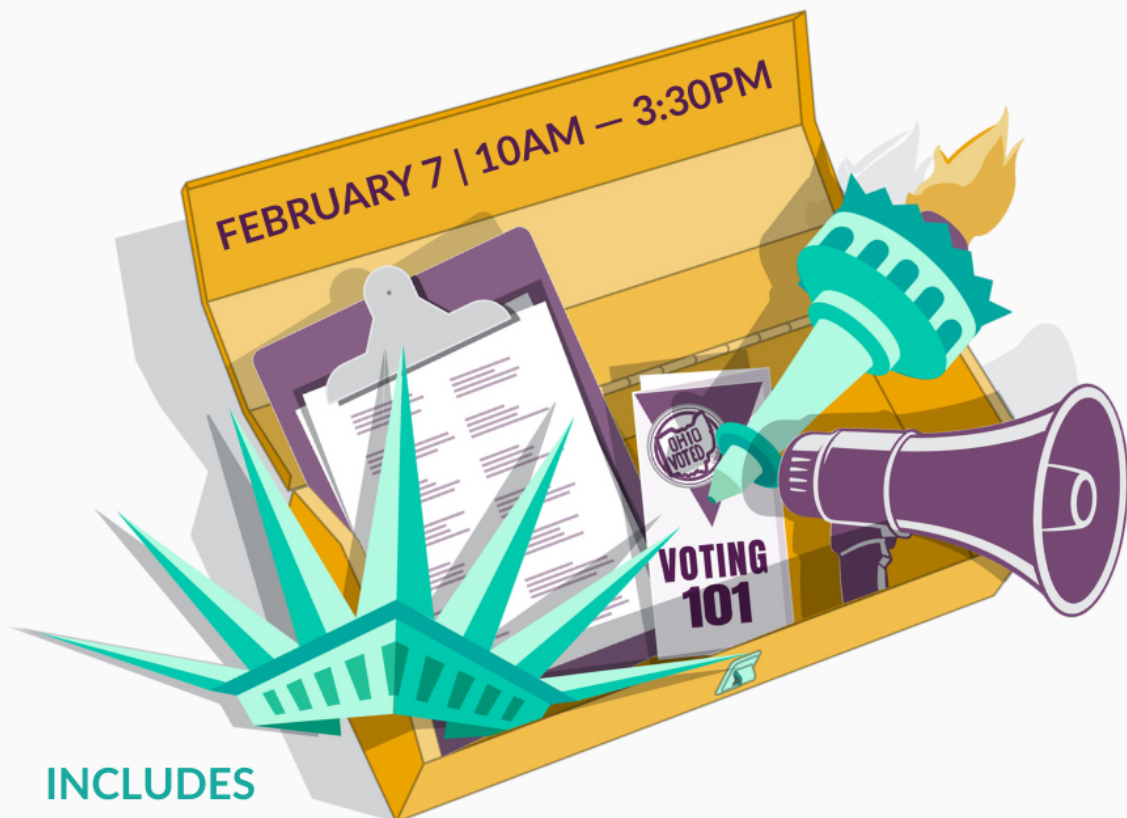

# Voter Service

*From the January 16, 2026*

**County offices up for election in 2026** | We've talked a lot about the [federal and state offices](#) on the ballot this year, and we'll continue to do so—each of those officials will have tremendous impact on the future of our state and nation for the foreseeable future. But there are two county offices all Ohio voters will also have the chance to vote on we also wanted to highlight: County Commissioner and County Auditor.

County Commissioners are the chief decision-makers for how public dollars are spent in our counties. Each county has three Commissioners; two are elected during presidential election years, and the other is elected during gubernatorial election years.

Of particular interest to us, County Commissioners control the budgets that fund county Boards of Elections, voting equipment, poll worker pay, early voting sites, and election security.

County Auditors are their county's chief fiscal officer, and the official who ensures tax laws are applied fairly and transparently.

They also establish property values for property taxes, administer property tax law, and calculate how much of the tax money collected by the county Treasurer goes to each county taxing entity, like school districts, and distributes the tax revenue. With property taxes being one of the biggest issues animating politicians at the state level and the subject of a potential proposed citizen-led initiative on the ballot this fall, County Auditor races across the state are bound to get more attention than usual.

We know many Ohioans are in the dark about how state and county government works. We'll be spending time this year helping connect voters and potential voters with information and resources to empower them to be informed voters. Stay tuned for new Voter Service materials and look for social media campaigns throughout the year.
