



What types of Voter ID are accepted?

Ohio's voter ID law has not changed.

- > Early voting (in person or by mail) requires your Ohio driver's license or state ID card number, the last 4 digits of your Social Security Number, or one of the items listed below.
- > The following types of ID are accepted on Election Day:
- <u>Ohio driver's license or state ID card</u> with your name and photo. The card cannot be expired, but it can have an old address.
- U.S. Military ID with your name and photo.
- <u>Unexpired government ID</u> with your name, current address, and photo. Student ID and Passports are not accepted.
- <u>Original or printed copy of one of the following documents</u> with your name and current address: utility bill (including cell phone bill), bank or financial statement, pay stub, government check, or other government document. Must be dated within the last year.
- If you do not have any of the above, you may use the <u>last 4 digits</u> of your Social Security number, but you will have to vote a provisional ballot. It will count so long as the number matches your voter registration. Be sure to complete all fields on the form.
