



Where should I vote if I moved?

If you are registered to vote in Ohio, but you moved and forgot to update your voter registration, here are your options:

1. <u>Early in-person voting.</u> Going to early vote is the easiest. There is only one location per county, so you don't have to guess where to go. You will have to cast a provisional ballot (unless you only moved within the same precinct), and your provisional will also serve to update your registration for next time. Your provisional will count so long as you don't also vote at the prior address where you were registered.

-OR-

2. Election Day voting at the polling location for your new address.

If voting on election day, you are supposed to go to the polling place for your new address, not your old ne polling place for your new address, not your old one. Look up your new polling place at <u>MyOhioVote.com</u> or <u>Vote411.org</u>, or call your Board of Elections. If you've only moved within the same precinct, you get a regular ballot. If you've moved farther away within the state, then you'll get a provisional ballot that will also serve to update your registration. The provisional will count so long as you don't try to yote at your old address too long as you don't try to vote at your old address too (no double voting).
