ABSENTEE VOTING

You may vote absentee before Election Day if you cannot appear to vote at your polling place on Election Day. You must have a reason or excuse.

Who can vote an absentee ballot?

- 1) Voters who are away from their municipality because of:
 - · business, duties or occupation
 - · leave of absence or sabbatical leave
 - vacation
 - · college student living at school
- 2) Voters who cannot go to the polling place because of:
 - illness or disabilty
 - · veterans who are bedridden or hospitalized
 - · observance of a religious holiday
 - election duties
- 3) Voters who are:
 - outside of the United States because of business and their accompanying spouses and dependents
 - serving in the armed forces or Merchant Marine

How do I request an absentee ballot?

- 1) You can request an absentee ballot by:
