LWVPA Intervenes in 2020 Election Audit Suit

The Commonwealth Court has granted the League of Women Voters of Pennsylvania, Common Cause Pennsylvania, Make the Road Pennsylvania, and several individual voters, including the Radnor League's Roberta Winters, the right to join the Pennsylvania Attorney General's lawsuit against state Senate Republicans' attempt to obtain private information about the state's registered voters.

The interveners argued successfully that they have an interest in the case because voters' constitutional right to privacy will be compromised if the Senate Republicans are allowed to enforce their subpoena for voters' private personal data. The Court granted the petition Oct. 27.

The League is represented by the American Civil Liberties Union of Pennsylvania, ACLU National, and the law firm Schnader Harrison Segal & Lewis LLP, the advocates and voters filed a motion to intervene in early October. They will now be a party to the case, meaning that their attorneys would participate in all court proceedings to help protect all voters' constitutional privacy rights.

The suit is in response to subpoenas issued by the Senate Intergovernmental Operations Committee to the Department of State on Sept. 15. The committee has demanded the names, addresses, dates of birth, driver's license numbers, and partial Social Security numbers of every registered voter in Pennsylvania. Pennsylvania has approximately 9 million registered voters.

"With this sham election review, Pennsylvania legislators are intentionally injecting discord into our election process and threatening the personal privacy of millions of voters," said Terrie Griffin, President of the League of Women Voters of Pennsylvania. "Pennsylvania's 2020 Election was executed safely and securely. This election review is a blatant attempt to weaken voters' trust in our election system while exposing their sensitive data to possible exploitation and manipulation. Voters' private data must be protected."

Candidates Forums, Voter Registration a Huge Success

Our three candidates forums in October were a phenomenal success. We hosted a forum for four Delaware County Council candidates that had been viewed by Oct. 28 by 380 people. Our Chester City Council candidates forum has been seen by 247 voters and our Media Borough Council candidates forum by 178 viewers. This is a much larger attendance/viewership than we were ever able to achieve with pre-pandemic in-person forums.

This is thanks to the hard work of our Voter Services Committee, led by our veteran negotiators and organizers, <u>Marita Green</u> and <u>Joanna Nealon</u>, and to our excellent moderators Jamie Mogil and Tiffany Griffin. What's Happening in Harrisburg?

A lot of things are in flux right now. The emphasis is on keeping our eyes on the Pa. Legislature's fiveperson reapportionment commission which has begun work on congressional redistricting for the next 10 years. This follows the court-determined redis-

LWV members have participated in five rallies and gatherings this year. tricting three years ago that resulted in the state going from 13 Republican districts and five Democratic districts to an even split of 9-9. You may recall, LWV had a little something to do with that suit.

Our two local Leagues, LWV-CDC and Radnor LWV both submitted written testimony Oct. 13 urging the commission to keep Delaware County whole within our own Congressional District 5 as it had historically been before the 2011 redistricting into the infamous "Donald kicking Goofy" gerrymandered district.

Our sister organization, Fair Districts PA, continues to work tirelessly to monitor the commission and we have some chance of coming out of this with competitive districts because, unlike 2011, we have a Democratic governor ready to veto any map that gets too out of whack, which would send the issue back to the Court.

As noted on Page 2, LWVPA has joined the suit in the Commonwealth Court to prevent the Legislature from obtaining our personal information for its farcical 2020 election "review."

House Bill 1800, the latest version of the omnibus election reform bill remains in committee. The first version, HB 1300, was vetoed by Gov. Tom Wolf over its drop box and voter ID provisions.

The state Supreme Court has heard oral arguments on Marsy's Law, the state constitutional amendment on victim's rights that LWV sued to overturn. The ballot question did not adhere to the state standards for putting amendments before the voters one subject at a time, making it impossible for voters make an informed decision. The opinion should be coming soon.
