ARE WE LETTING THE FOXES GUARD THE HENHOUSE?




- When politicians draw their own districts, the party in charge can create safe seats for its members and a built-in majority for itself
- Voters get less choice too many races are uncontested
- Without competition, politician don't have to listen to their constituents partisanship increases and becomes more extreme

SUPPORT A BETTER WAY TO DRAW OUR ELECTORAL MAPS:


An **nonpartisan commission**, independent of the politicians, should draw the maps <u>with</u> voter input and transparency and <u>without</u> information on citizens' party or how they vote

Here's how <u>either party</u> can gerrymander the districts to win <u>more</u> than its fair share of seats:


- Map 1 looks good at first glance: Stripers get
 2 and Dotters get 3. But five safe seats mean
 no competition, no choice for voters.
- Map 2 was drawn by the Dotters so they will
 WIN ALL 5! 2 in 5 voters are Stripers, but they can never win even a single seat.
- Map 3 was drawn by the Stripers to guarantee a Striper majority (3-2), even though they have far fewer voters.




50 voters (20 Stripers, 30 Dotters) elect 5 representatives



Stripers win 2, Dotters 3 BUT VOTERS STILL LOSE!



Dotters win all 5, BUT VOTERS LOSE!



Stripers win 3-2, BUT VOTERS LOSE!

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
