# COMAL TRINITY GROUNDWATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT ADVOCACY

The League of Women Voters of Texas supports measures for the protection, conservation, and development of the groundwater resources of the state as an integral part of the comprehensive state water plan, and groundwater management that would achieve the following objectives:

Assure the long-term productivity of the state's groundwater resources and availability of groundwater supplies Minimize adverse effects of groundwater withdrawals, including land subsidence and reduction of spring flows



# COMAL COUNTY REGIONAL HABITAT CONSERVATION PLAN

The League of Women Voters of Texas supports a comprehensive state land use policy to provide for the orderly development of the state, including:

- Growth and development of an area being compatible with the degree of availability of essential natural resources in that area
- Identification and protection of areas of particular significance (historical, archaeological, aesthetic, recreational) and rare or fragile ecosystems.
- Planning being carried out at the local level should be the main thrust of land use



### WHEN LEAGUES TAKES ACTION

- Only acts on an issue when we have a local, <u>state</u>, or <u>national position</u> or are acting under <u>League principles</u>.
- Never lobbies in opposition to a League position.
- May use any local, state, or national position to lobby at the local governmental level <u>only</u> without asking for authorization from state or national
- If advocacy is directed at a regional governmental body, coordinate with other Leagues.

# TEXAS LEGISLATURE IN BRIEF

- Meets every two years between January and May
- 150 House Representatives (2 years)
- 31 Senators (4 years)
- Speaker of the House (elected by Reps.)
- Lieutenant Governor (4 years) presides over the Texas State Senate.

Action Tip #2 All states have governors, but the Texas governor is among the weakest.

# Meets Every Other Year On the odd numbered years

# Bills Passed

The Texas Constitution limits the passing of bills to the last three months of the session.

### Competition: 7,000 Bills

Decisions have to made in an extremely short amount of time.

# BILLS LIVE & DIE BY DATES

- Nov. 12, 2018 First day to file bills
- January 8, 2019 (1<sup>st</sup> day)
- March 8, 2019 60th day Deadline for filing bills & joint resolutions
- May, Last day to send House bills to calendar committee...
- One week before last day of session at midnight last day for House floor discussion and voting on bills.
- May 27<sup>th</sup>! Last Day of Regular Session!
- June 16, 2019 20 days after the last day is the last day the governor can sign or veto bills
- August 26<sup>-</sup> 2019 91st day following final adjournment Date that bills without specific effective dates become law.

Action Tip #4 The only bill the Legislator has to pass is the budget bill!



### **How a Bill Becomes Law**

**Tip #5**: Stop bad bills in committee instead of on the House or Senate floor.

Bill is introduced Referred to First Reading of Idea by member of House or Senate Bill **House or Senate** Committee Committee **Third Reading of Debate on Bill** reports bill to **Second Reading Bill, Final Debate** members of and First Vote of Bill and Vote **House or Senate** If passed, Bill is sent to If House and Senate Bills If passed, the Bill may be the second chamber differ, Bill goes to signed into law or vetoed conference committee by the Governor where the process repeats

# **ACTION TIP #7:** IT IS EASY TO CALL!

- Write your message
- Make it short
- Say your name & your hometown
- Mention if you live in the legislator's district.
- Explain why you are calling. Identify the bill number & issue.
- Offer 1 or 2 brief talking points & offer local examples if possible.
- Provide your contact information.
- Calls to the capital office have more impact than call to the district office unless legislators are home on recess.
- Thank the staff member for his or her time.





## **VISIT YOUR PUBLIC OFFICIALS**

- Talk with your official or their staff
- Bring information about League LWVTX priority issues
- Smile & see talking points on priority issues.

**Tip #8** Use their correct tittle: Speaker, Lieutenant Governor, Chairman, Mister or Madam Chair, Senator, Representative



**Tip #9:** Elected officials love to talk. Listen!


